The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint. —Léon Bloy (1846-1917)

The month of November presents us with a series of gospel parables from St. Matthew's twenty-fifth chapter that engage us with the final realities of life. That final judgment awaits is to be properly forewarned. To help shake off any temptations of lethargy or indifference, the cited quote from the French writer, Leon Bloy, serves well. Born in southern France, east of Bordeaux, in the aftermath of the Revolution, his conversion to the Catholic faith was sparked by the apparitions of Our Lady of La Salette, the same year of his birth. Eventually moving to a suburb of Paris, Bloy saw the banality and despair of French culture that had divorced itself from its Medieval chivalrous Catholic roots. While most of us are not familiar with 19th century literature (his contemporaries, Edgar Allen Poe, Dostoevsky, Charles Dickens, Mary Shelley), the period of upheaval was often portrayed not with a bursting optimism but a melancholy and a shocking realism. Leon Bloy believed the need for conversion was urgent and sided with the poor and victims of a new secular age. Though prolific in his literary output, he lived meagerly and with little financial remuneration. Leon Bloy wrote graphically about suffering and the darkness of the human heart... (prostitution, corruption, violence, murder); he sided those who felt themselves to be on the losing side of life. Despite touted signs of progress and improvement of a new scientific age, Bloy saw a world of spiritual battle where God was sustaining the afflicted in their relentless attacks at the hands of those blinded by their stubborn pride at denying life's ultimate realities. While he disturbed and annoyed many of his era, the ensuing horrors of the 20th century vindicated him in intellectual circles as a tortured prophet of his times.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The readings this weekend gives us an idea of how we are supposed to live and prepare for the future. There is a balance in the Christian life between knowing that Christ might come back tomorrow, but at the same time, living as if He may not come back in our lifetime.



If we go off on one extreme or the other, we end up with problems. For example, in 1 Thessalonians 4-5, Paul wrote that the Lord's return was near, and so the Christians in Thessalonica should live with that in mind. But apparently, some of them thought that since the Lord's coming was so near, they could quit their jobs, and sit at home fasting and praying and watching the sky for the clouds to be rolled up like a scroll. Paul heard about this, and so wrote his second letter to the Thessalonians to tell them that although the Lord's return was near and they need to live in light of that, they must also live as if His coming was far off. We must be laying foundations and fighting the good fight for future generations.
