The Church has no other reason for existence than, by developing the Kingdom of Christ on earth, to make mankind participate in the effects of His saving Redemption. Whoever, by Divine Commission, takes the place on earth of Jesus Christ, becomes thereby the Chief Shepherd who, far from being able to rest content with simply guiding and protecting the Lord's Flock which has been confided to him to rule, fails in his special duty and obligations if he does not strive by might and main to win over and to join to Christ all who are still without the Fold.

- Pope Pius XI, from his 1926 encyclical, Rerum Ecclesia On the Solemnity of Christ the King, the fervour of Pius XI urges us on in trying to order all things under his sovereign reign. While the tally of disappointments and confusions can break our resolve in wanting to carry out our divine mission, important to remember is that Christ is already ascended to heaven and in his majesty watches attentively over his chosen; he is not merely an absent landowner who will show up for a day of fierce reckoning but already now has entered into his glory and provides us with the sufficient grace to fulfill the particulars of what has been entrusted to us. Ever enticing is a mentality to view the Church and local parish as the equivalent to a convenient store. I enter in, quickly take what I need, pay the expected fee, and have very little concern as to the well-being of the business so long as it stocks the desired items I may need at whatever opportune time of my choosing. Even more tempting is to view the Church as merely a social institution where, like a community centre, we gather with familiar neighbours to be welcomed, heard, affirmed, accompanied, and supported. Christ instituted his Church for sanctification to combat all that is evil in the world and to help us to love one another beyond the bonds of natural friendships. The Churches' mission is one of always leading others to repentance and grace.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today on the feast of Christ the King we reflect on the idea od kingship. The whole notion of kingship is an odd one for someone living in the early 21st century, at least it is for me. What does kingship even mean to me? As a Canadian, I am technically governed by a monarch, but the monarch is almost strictly a figurehead in terms of government and

law-making. Most monarchies today have little or no impact on the daily lives of their subjects. A King or a Queen is mostly a relic, a tradition that ties one to the past of a country but has little impact on the actual ruling of a people.

So the root image of "The Solemnity of Christ the King" needs an act of imagination on my part to transform the images that regularly reside in my mind when I think of monarchy: weak, ineffectual, meaningless, rich figureheads; or cruel, unjust, petty thugs. The one has no actual power, the other only misuses power.

Yet, the desire for a King, a righteous King, the one to rule perfectly, is what lies behind the Israelite desire for Kingship. It is, I would argue, what lies behind all of our desire for government. We continue to elect leaders, as we must and should, in the hopes that they will lead us to the Promised Land and then feel betrayed when either they become entangled in ethics violations, make stupid decisions, or fall short of expectations. If it is true, though, that "our hearts are restless until they rest in thee, O Lord" (*Confessions*, Book 1), then our yearnings here in the City of Man must have their true desire in the City of God. We need, we want God to rule us because he is the perfect King.
