


PARISH MISSION

Sister of the Little Workers of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary

While she does not like to disclose any personal information regarding her date of birth, certain details of this 60-something year old nun can not be concealed. The oldest daughter of 6 siblings, raised in the suburbs of Washington, D.C., she chose to follow in her father's footsteps by entering medical school. To help pay for her studies, Sr. Dede enlisted in the U.S. army's medical corps. She served for 29 years as a surgeon, earning the rank of Colonel. She was deployed in the countries of Kenya, Iraq, Sudan, Haiti, and Afghanistan. Always faithful to her Catholic upbringing, she discerned her vocation to religious life when put in charge of supervising Mother Teresa of Calcutta's 1997 American visit. Sr. Dede Byrne's religious order allows her to continue her profession by serving in poor areas offering free medical aid.

On this third Sunday of Advent, she too, like John the Baptist, is a powerful, prophetic voice seeking to direct all attention away from herself and testify to Him who is light, so that all might believe through Him. (Jn 1.7)

Pastor's desk

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The mysterious figure of John the Baptist, introduced in last week's readings, comes into sharper focus today. Who he is, we see in today's Gospel, is best understood by who he isn't.

He is not Elijah returned from the heavens, although like him he dresses in the prophet's attire and preaches repentance and judgment.

Not Elijah in the flesh, John is nonetheless sent in the spirit and power of Elijah to fulfill his mission.

Neither is John the prophet Moses foretold, although he is a kinsman and speaks God's word. Nor is John the Messiah, though he has been anointed by the Spirit since he was in the womb

John prepares the way for the Lord. The baptism he performs is symbolic, not sacramental. It is a sign given to stir our hearts to repentance.

John shows us the One upon whom the Spirit remains, the One who fulfills the promise we hear in today's First Reading. Jesus' bath of rebirth and the Spirit opens a fountain that purifies Israel and gives to all a new heart and a new Spirit.

John comes to us in the Advent readings to show us the light, that we might believe in the One who comes at Christmas. As we sing in today's Responsorial, the Mighty One has come to lift each of us up, to fill our hunger with bread from heaven.

And as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we should rejoice, give thanks, and pray without ceasing that God will make us perfectly holy in spirit, soul, and body—that we may be blameless when our Lord comes.
