

Quite soon, I shall find myself before the final judge of my life. Even though, as I look back on my long life, I can have great reason for fear and trembling, I am nonetheless of good cheer, for I trust firmly that the Lord is not only the just judge, but also the friend and brother who himself has already suffered for my shortcomings, and is thus also my advocate, my "Paraclete". In light of the hour of judgment, the grace of being a Christian becomes all the more clear to me. It grants me knowledge, and indeed friendship, with the judge of my life, and thus allows me to pass confidently through the dark door of death. In this regard, I am constantly reminded of what John tells us at the beginning of the Apocalypse: he sees the Son of Man in all his grandeur and falls at his feet as though dead. Yet He, placing his right hand on him, says to him: "Do not be afraid! It is I..."

The coinciding of New Year's eve and the one year anniversary of the death of Pope Benedict XVI offers the opportunity for retrospective insight. The varied criticisms of his papacy are as numerous as the conjecture surrounding his resignation. For some, Pope Benedict XVI was reviled for his firm conservatism; for others, he was not strong enough in rebuking those who were undermining the Church from within. As time elapses, a fair evaluation ought to include the treasury of his penetrating and prescient thought and writing. As an astute first class scholar, the priest and bishop, Joseph Ratzinger understood well the tumultuous period of the 20th century and the efforts of the Second Vatican Council to address the unfolding crisis of a rebellious world to traditional Catholicism. The cited quote is taken from his last known public statement. At 92 years of age, he was being indicted for mishandling of abuse cases from his time of overseeing his diocese of Munich-Freising, some 40+ years ago. Laying in plain evidence is his conscience. Such transparency speaks of the mystery of one who has grappled with the world's evils and his best efforts of serving the Church as devotedly as possible. Whatever one's feelings about the former Roman Pontiff, one cannot help but envy his articulate, humble confidence in surveying his life and looking forward with hope to his definitive encounter with Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The church has found many reasons to mark the importance of today's feast. Aside from celebrating the secular calendar's turn to the new year, an appropriate time for prayer and thanksgiving, this day is also the eighth day after our celebration of the birth of Christ. Older Catholics can probably remember a time when



this feast celebrated Jesus' circumcision, which according to Jewish law took place on the eighth day after his birth. At various times in history, today's feast also celebrated the Holy Name of Jesus, which we now remember on Jan. 3. References to each of those commemorations appear in today's Gospel. Some of the earliest celebrations of this feast in Rome, however, focused attention on Mary's mission to be the mother of God, and it was that mission that inspired later generations of Christians.

The world first received Jesus through Mary, but the task is not yet complete. The liberation Jesus preached has not yet become a reality. We have now become the point of continuity that Mary was in Luke's Gospel. When we give ourselves over to Christ's mission in big ways and small, we offer Christ to the world in new ways. Part of our discipleship is the search for Christ as he is already at work, letting him surprise us with all the unexpected twists and turns of salvation history as it continues to unfold. If we seek him in the signs of the times, we can make his presence known to all whose slavery will end when his love appears. This is what Mary proclaimed when she became the mother of God, and this is the mission his disciples can continue today following her example.
