

"My eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the sight of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel. This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed."

Canticle of Simeon, Lk 2.30-32,34-35

As part of the Christmas narrative, the prophecy of Simeon at the time of the Presentation is equally fitting for the Feast of the Epiphany. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, the magi are representatives of the neighboring pagan religions and they too are welcomed to receive the revelation of salvation from the Christ Child. The King of the Nations, through the lineage of the Jewish people, is to be confessed and worshiped by all through the succeeding generations - baptized and those to be baptized. All are plunged into the dramatic conflict of accepting God's best and final gift of redemption. Then, as now, the implications of this revelation could not be higher. The birth of the Messiah invites all to conversion and faith; the self-identified Christian, Muslim, Jew, Hindu, Sikh, atheist... must each recognize that no self-justification or rationalization is sufficient when all of humanity is mired in the grip of sin. When presenting Jesus as the sole mediator between God and man, we know all too well all the politically incorrect concerns of coercion and proselytism. And so, how important it is to remember and celebrate the joy of the likes of the Magi, the Shepherds, Simeon and Anna, Zacharia and Elizabeth, Joachim and Ann, and Mary and Joseph in seeing the long-desired fulfillment of the Saviour's coming. In a world broken by war and confusion, the faithful are called to give testimony to the truth of the Prince of Peace.


