Old wood to burn! Old wine to drink! Old friends to trust! Old authors to read!

Alphonso X, El Sabio, King of Castille, Galicia, Leon (1221-1284)

Still fresh into the new year, the venerable historical figure of King Alphonso X beckons to honouring a time of great nobility. His father was King St. Ferdinand of Spain and as his son, he wanted to continue his heroic legacy. While the cited quote seems to suggest a clinging to a nostalgic past, the life and times of King Alphonso X could not have been any more progressive and liberating. His grandfather, Alphonso IX, founded the prestigious university of Salamanca. Accordingly, Alphonso X benefited from a formidable and pious education. His wise and learned policies led Spain through the midway point of the Reconquista. Since the 8th century, the Moorish Caliphate had extended its way beyond Morocco to capture great territory. The push back had occurred in various stages in the ensuing centuries by his ancestors. To the remaining Islamic forces that inhabited southern Spain, he not only defended his people from having to pay the Sharia tribute but advanced culture as a way of gaining the minds and hearts of a population that had grown weary and disheartened from constant rampage and destruction. The study of architecture, economics, literature, music, sports, games were proposed as a way of helping neutralize religious factions. Moreover, rather than downplay and dismiss his Catholic heritage, Alphonso X encouraged clergy to celebrate the liturgy solemnly, with absolute fidelity in its proclamation, chant and prayer.

For those following the turbulent times of the current Spanish political landscape, an anchoring in the bedrock of tradition ought to be a helpful strategy against those who are wanting to erase and cancel the Catholic public voice. Reports have widely circulated on how ruling socialists have sought to ban and render illegal the public recitation of the Rosary. Consequently, an embrace of the most historically enduring of things can awaken the best and novel of things.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The readings reveal that the apostles are the first of a new people of God, the Church—a new family, based not on blood ties, but on belief in Jesus and a desire to do the Father's will. We are now God's chosen people.



From now on, even our most important worldly con-

cerns—family relations, occupations, and possessions—must be judged in light of the Gospel, Paul says in today's Epistle.

The first word of Jesus' Gospel—repent—means we must totally change our way of thinking and living, turning from evil, doing all for the love of God.

And we should be consoled by Nineveh's repentance in today's First Reading. Even the wicked Nineveh could repent at Jonah's preaching. And in Jesus we have "something greater than Jonah". We have God come as our savior, to show sinners the way, as we sing in today's Psalm. This should give us hope—that loved ones who remain far from God will find compassion if they turn to Him. But we, too, must continue along the path of repentance—striving daily to pattern our lives after His.

Each day is a daily struggle where we take up our cross and follow him. We have to renew our trust in him knowing he is always there for us. But also resist the temptation to find worldly solutions to our problems. Not giving in to what this world offers but trusting that God will work for us in his own time.


