Celebrated widely throughout the Spanish speaking world, devotion to our Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of Candelaria is traced back to the port of Santa Cruz de Tenerife of the Canary Islands. Popular legend tells a story of how, back in the late 14th century, two herdsmen discovered a statue, washed up on shore, of a lady with a child held in one arm and a candle in the other. Never having seen anything comparable, they were suspicious of a carved image depicted as a feminine deity. They tried to destroy it with by throwing stones and chopping it with a machete but ended up harming themselves. Intrigued by its apparent supernatural powers, they summoned their local chief to further investigate the mystery. As he tried to carry it away, the statue took on extraordinary weight. A Christian slave, captured from the times of the crusades, correctly identified the statue of Our Blessed Mother. The statue was the catalyst of not only helping to convert the island to the Christian faith, draw favour with Spain, but also repel the influence of neighboring Muslim Morocco, located just 100 km offshore. Sailors, in the ensuing decades, spread devotion to her throughout Spain's navigational expansion – from Ecuador to El Salvador, from Puerto Rico to the Philippines. As February 2 marks the liturgical feast of the Presentation of the Child Jesus and the traditional Candelmas/Purification of Mary Feast, let us not only renew our confidence in her maternal intercession but permit ourselves to imagine participating in their faith-filled processions, in one of these enviable tropical locations.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's First Reading, Job describes the futility of life before Christ. His lament reminds us of the curse of toil and death placed upon Adam following his original sin. Men and women are like slaves seeking shade, unable to find rest. Their lives are like the wind that comes and



But, as we sing in today's Psalm, He who created the stars promised to heal the brokenhearted and gather those lost in exile from Him. We see this promise fulfilled in today's Gospel.

In the Gospel reading Jesus grasps Simon's mother in law by the hand and helps her up. The word translated "help" is actually Greek for "raising up." The same verb is used when Jesus commands a dead girl to arise. It's used again to describe His own resurrection.

What Jesus has done for Simon's mother-in-law, He has done for all humanity—raised all of us who lay dead through our sins.

Notice all the words of totality and completeness in the Gospel. The whole town gathers; all the sick are brought to Him. He drives out demons in the whole of Galilee. Everyone is looking for Christ.

We too have found Him. By our baptism, He healed and raised us to live in His presence.

Like Simon's mother-in-law, there is only one way we can thank Him for the new life He has given us. We must rise to serve Him and His gospel.

Our lives must be our thanksgiving, as Paul describes in today's Epistle. We must tell everyone the good news, the purpose for which Jesus has come—that others, too, may have a share in this salvation.
