That is why, regardless if they label me or our front, I want an Argentina with life, liberty and property. Todo per Argentina!

As Lent unfolds, weaning oneself off of the unnerving vicissitudes of geopolitics is a good spiritual practice. And so, while the happenings of national proceedings far removed from one's immediate circumstances ought to be of relatively little interest, there is something intriguing in what is unfolding in Argentina. Beyond typical conservative vs. liberal divides, most are aware of Javier Milei, the recently elected Argentinian President and his world-wide viral headlines of revving up a chainsaw in vowing to hold to his campaign promise of slashing excess spending from the previous office holders. His dire message to his fellow citizens, facing runaway inflation, is that austerity is inevitable and remedial when it comes to rebuilding the country's fate. It promises to be a long, long Lent of painful and penitential self-denial.

His running mate, the soon to be 49 year old, Mrs. Victoria Villarruel, raised in a military family background, a lawyer, author, and civil rights advocate by profession, is also a devout Catholic. Vicky, as she is respectfully and affectionately referred to, is striving to do what few politicians are daring to do- allow the social doctrine of the Catholic Church to inform all her public decisions. She has discerned that the country's social policies of abortion promotion and redefinition of traditional marriage and family need to be addressed if the economic problems are to be rectified. She shall surely face intense political pressure, calumny, and slander. Her effort is to be admired and followed intently as a lesson for all the faithful. To their credit, the citizens of Argentina acknowledge that this arduous path of hard work, self-control, and personal accountability is the only viable way to move forward. Flowing from their World Cup win, their shared patriotic elation recognizes that team discipline can yield tremendously proud and prosperous results.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The cleansing of the temple in today's gospel asserts Jesus' claim to be the focus of true worship. He is the Lord the prophets said would come—to purify the temple, banish the merchants, and make it a house of prayer for all peoples.



The God who made the heavens and the earth, who brought Israel out of slavery, does not dwell in sanctuaries made by human hands.

Nor does He need offerings of oxen, sheep, or doves.

Notice in today's First Reading that God did not originally command animal sacrifices—only that Israel heed His commandments. His law was a gift of divine wisdom, as we sing in today's Psalm. It was a law of love, perfectly expressed in Christ's self-offering on the Cross.

This is the "sign" Jesus offers in the Gospel today—the sign that caused Jewish leaders to stumble, as Paul tells us in the Epistle. Jesus' body—destroyed on the Cross and raised up three days later—is the new and true sanctuary. From the temple of His body, rivers of living water flow, the Spirit of grace that makes each of us a temple and together builds us into a dwelling place of God.

In the Eucharist we participate in His offering of His body and blood. This is the worship in Spirit and in truth that the Father desires.
