Nine years ago, March 15, 2015, twenty year old Akash Bashir was standing guard as volunteer security at his home parish of St. John, in the Archdiocese of Lahore, Pakistan. Knowing the ever-looming danger of a terrorist attack, Akash's instinct and courage kicked into action on that fateful day. When a suspicious man tried to barge his way into the Church, Akash was standing watch. The jihadist declared his malicious intention. Akash seized him at the door and declared, "I will die but I will not let you go in!" Akash and two others died instantly from the detonation of the suicide bomb blast. The rest of the 1000 faithful inside the Church were spared. At that same time, at a neighbouring parish, the same Islamic militant group carried out a simultaneous foray and killed 17 while seriously injuring another 70 Catholics.

As the cited quote indicates, his parents are left with the valiant and sacrificial act of their son. Knowing the cost of what it is to be disciples of Jesus Christ, they never shied away from the practice of their faith as a family. They form part of the vibrant Christian community in the Youhanabad district of Lahore that educates their children in the Salesian tradition of fostering giftedness and generosity in service to God and neighbour. Akash's witness leaves us all with the wonder of considering what each of us as individuals would do if ever confronted with such a moment? May this Lenten season strengthen and renew us in the boldness of professing the saving mysteries we share.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Sunday readings in Lent have been showing us the high points of salvation history—God's covenant with creation in the time of Noah; His promises to Abraham; the law He gave to Israel at Sinai.



In today's First Reading, we hear of the destruction of the kingdom established by God's final Old Testament covenant—the covenant with David.

His chosen people abandoned the law He gave them. For their sins, the temple was destroyed, and they were exiled in Babylon. We hear their sorrow and repentance in the exile lament we sing as today's Psalm.

But we also hear how God, in His mercy, gathered them back, even anointing a pagan king to shepherd them and rebuild the temple.

God is rich in mercy, as today's Epistle teaches. He promised that David's kingdom would last forever, that David's son would be His Son and rule all nations . In Jesus, God keeps that promise .

Moses lifted up the serpent as a sign of salvation. Now Jesus is lifted up on the Cross, to draw all people to Himself.

Those who refuse to believe in this sign of the Father's love condemn themselves—as the Israelites in their infidelity brought judgment upon themselves.

But God did not leave Israel in exile, and He does not want to leave any of us dead in our transgressions. We are God's handiwork, saved to live as His people in the light of His truth.

Midway through this season of repentance, let us again behold the Pierced One (see John 19:37) and rededicate ourselves to living the "good works" that God has prepared us for
