To you our praise is due in Zion, O God. To you we pay our vows, you who hear our prayer. To you all flesh will come with its burden of sin. Too heavy for us, our offenses, but you wipe them away. Blessed is he whom you choose and call to dwell in your courts. We are filled with the blessings of your house, of your holy temple. You keep your pledges with wonders, O God our savior, the hope of all the earth and of far distant isles. You uphold the mountains with your strength, you are girded with power. You still the roaring of the seas, the roaring of their waves and the tumult of the peoples. The ends of the earth stand in awe at the sight of your wonders. The lands of sunrise and sunset you fill with your joy. Psalm 68.1-8

It is impossible to fake authentic Easter glory. The Easter liturgy is overflowing with acclamations inviting us to lift our voices in worship; if one is not interiorly so inclined, attempts will surely be paltry. And so, even if one is not swept into the exaltation of Paschal praise, at least to acknowledge with reverence and adoration Our Lord's triumphant victory is within our capability. The venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen aptly stated, "Our Lord died mounted on a Cross, not sitting on a fence." The celebration of Easter Sunday and the ensuing season will urge us to confess that at great cost to himself, Jesus shed his blood in a horrific death, and in so doing has defeated Satan's tyranny for those receptive to the grace of renouncing sin and professing faith in the promises of eternal salvation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The tomb was empty. In the early morning darkness of that first Easter, there was only confusion for Mary Magdalene and the other disciples. But as the daylight spread, they saw the dawning of a new creation.



At first they didn't understand the Scripture, today's Gospel tells us. We don't know which precise Scripture texts they were supposed to understand. Perhaps it was

the sign of Jonah, who rose from the belly of the great fish after three days (see Jonah 1:17). Or maybe Hosea's prophecy of Israel's restoration from exile (see <u>Hosea 6:2</u>). Perhaps it was the psalmist who rejoiced that God had not abandoned him to the netherworld (see <u>Psalm 16:9–10</u>).

Whichever Scripture it was, as the disciples bent down into the tomb, they saw and they believed. What did they see? Burial shrouds in an empty tomb. The stone removed from the tomb. Seven times in nine verses we hear that word—"tomb."

What did they believe? That God had done what Jesus said He would do—raised Him up on the third day.

What they saw and believed they bore witness to, as today's First Reading tells us. Peter's speech is a summary of the gospels—from Jesus' baptism in the Jordan to His hanging on a tree, to His rising from the dead.

We are children of the apostles, born into the new world of their witness. Our lives are now "hidden with Christ in God," as today's Epistle says. Like them, we gather in the morning on the first day of the week —to celebrate the Eucharist, the feast of the empty tomb.

We rejoice that the stones have been rolled away from our tombs, too. Each of us can shout, as we do in today's Psalm: "I shall not die, but live." They saw and believed. And we await the day they promised would come—when we, too, "will appear with Him in glory." **f... Roger**
