Wherefore, we honour thee as an equal to the angels and an honourable and holy hierarch.

Holy father, Porphyrios, pray to God for us.


Greek Orthodox prayer to St. Porphyrius, Bishop of Gaza, (347-420)


Originating from the affluent Aegean coastal city of Thessalonica, the young Porphyrius was of such wealthy background that his parents named him after the costly "purple" dye that symbolized imperial power. From his notable education and upbringing, he opted instead to divest himself of his wealth and seek out monastic discipline in the deserts of Egypt. Throughout his formation, Porphyrius was introduced, instructed, and collaborated with formidable men such as Sts. Macarius (Hermit), Jerome (Biblical Translator), and John of Chrysostom (Bishop). Challenged by poor health, he left his monastic cell to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem seeking healing and strength. At the holy site of Golgotha, Our Lord revealed to him that he was to be entrusted with the relics of the Holy Cross. On account of his reputation for holiness, the Patriarch of Jerusalem ordained him and he was subsequently given charge of the harassed flock of Christians living in Gaza, Palestine - indeed equipping him with the relics of the holy Cross. Through fasting, prayer, processions, and appealing to the Emperor in Constantinople, St. Porphyrius was successful in confronting and converting the Palestinians who persecuted the small Christian community by having their pagan temples demolished and converted into Churches. One of the few Christian Churches that have survived the elapse of time is dedicated to St. Porphyrius' memory and patronage.

In the midst of the disturbing events of the current Israeli-Palestinian war, the Christian community has been reduced to a mere 1000 faithful. It is no wonder that there are such intense and bitter resentments being felt by combatants, civilians, and sympathizers everywhere. The reliability of news accounts is, of course, tilted and biased towards whatever faction and interpretation of history one holds. In our Gospel reading account of the upper room appearance, it is only the glorified body of our Risen Lord, with wounds still intact, that can overcome the disbelief, terror, and trauma of what the crucifixion signified. May our Lord amplify and bolster the mission of giving witness to his victory over death – especially in the face of worldwide broadcasts of carnage, destruction, displacement and despair of those who inhabit the same land as St. Porphyrius of old.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus in today's Gospel teaches His apostles how to interpret the Scriptures.





In today's First Reading and Epistle, we see the beginnings of that mission. And we see the apostles interpreting the Scriptures as Jesus taught them to.

God has brought to fulfillment what He announced beforehand in all the prophets, Peter preaches. His sermon is shot through with Old Testament images. He evokes Moses and the Exodus, in which God revealed himself as the ancestral God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He identifies Jesus as Isaiah's suffering servant who has been glorified.

John, too, describes Jesus in Old Testament terms. Alluding to how Israel's priests offered blood sacrifices to atone for the people's sins (see Leviticus 16; Hebrews 9–10), he says that Jesus intercedes for us before God, and that His blood is a sacrificial expiation for the sins of the world.

Notice that in all three readings, the Scriptures are interpreted to serve and advance the Church's mission—to reveal the truth about Jesus, to bring people to repentance, the wiping away of sins, and the perfection of their love for God.

This is how we, too, should hear the Scriptures. Not to know more "about" Jesus, but to truly know Him personally, and to know His plan for our lives.

In the Scriptures, the light of His face shines upon us, as we sing in today's Psalm. We know the wonders He has done throughout history. And we have the confidence to call to Him, and to know that He hears and answers.


