These events have had no equal in the past, neither in the East nor in the West.
- Coptic Orthodox Bishop Gregorius, first witness account of the apparitions at Zeitoun, Egypt, 1968

The extraordinary events that took place over 55 years ago in the town of Zeitoun, north of Cairo, are astounding for multiple reasons. Despite hundreds of thousands of witnesses having seen our Blessed Mother, few have even heard of the apparition. Despite camera and video footage with Catholics, Orthodox, Coptic, Protestants, Muslim and Jews all part of the immense crowds that gathered to participate in the widely shared miracle, to this day the memory and significance of the event has been eclipsed.

Consequently, the story is worth recounting; one is encouraged to research for one-self that which can be seen on any browse of the internet. The origins of the apparition can be traced back to 1920 when a wealthy Egyptian Coptic merchant was looking to invest in property development. He was told in a dream to build a church to honour the memory of the Holy Family's stay in Egypt and that in due time the shrine would be blessed with a miracle. Providence arranged for April 2, 1968 to fulfill the promise. Two Muslim workers spotted a woman at the top of the domed Church. Fearing that she was some distraught nun contemplating suicide, they yelled out words of alarm and reassurance to the figure. With a crowd gathering, the priests of the Church were alerted of the unfolding crisis. In the ensuing commotion, news spread that the luminous figure was no mere human being. Evening after evening for the subsequent three years, all could see the radiant silent figure of a woman crowned and surrounded by bright doves who hovered and flew around her as if in battle formation.

The immediate effects of the apparitions is perhaps that which is most remarkable. In the year prior, Israeli-Arab conflict boiled over in the Six Day war of June, 1967. The countries of Jordan, Egypt, Syria were soundly defeated by American backed Israeli forces. Avenging reprisal, Muslims were already marking the homes of Christians with a red cross. The undeniable outpouring of grace and goodwill that flowed from the Blessed Virgin Mary's presence compelled the Islamic militants to reconsider their plans of vowed retribution. Obviously, a revival of devotion to the memory of Our Lady of Zeitoun and her conciliatory heavenly invitation is so desperately needed in the unfolding crisis of the current catastrophe.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be - the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations.

In Baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist.

Paul in today's First Reading seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine—His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, Paul encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life.

We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness.

Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us - as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as pruning, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness.

We need to always remain rooted in Him, as today's Epistle tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us, and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing.

As we sing in today's Psalm, we must fulfill our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives.
