I prayed to Vallarpadathamma for help and vowed our allegiance by becoming her servants, the boat capsized and I, together with my son sank into the deep. We went straight to the bottom of the sea and found ourselves at peace in the presence of Vallarpadathamma. We were in such a serene and beautiful place that we did not feel the passing of time. We were just gazing at the face of Our Lady and her Son. Now we find ourselves at the feet of the same Vallarpadathamma.

- Testimony of Meenakshi-Amma and the miraculous rescue that saved her and her son in May 1752, Kochi, Kerala, Our Lady of Ransom

With the arrival of Vasco da Gamma, early 16th century Portuguese missionary efforts were quick to display the splendor of Catholic worship through the building of beautiful churches. On one of the islands (Vallarpadath) that comprise the Keralan coastline, one such church housed and venerated an imported painting of Our Lady (Amma) of Ransom. When subsequent typhoon floods swept the painting away, the supernatural quality of the work made an impression on the Hindu Keralan governor when he retrieved it from the backwaters and the image showed no signs of damage. The cited quote is taken from the account of a Hindu noblewoman whose boat was capsized in a storm. While clinging to life for 3 days, she prayed to the Lady, whose renown she had heard of, that her life and that of son's be spared. It was the dream of a local priest that instructed fishermen on the precise location of where to lower the nets so as to rescue the drowning pair who had just prior to the fishermen's arrival lost grip of their floating support, overcome with utter exhaustion. Shortly thereafter, both mother and son were baptized and promoted devotion through the retelling of their story.

As we enter into the month of May and its Marian devotion, how recurring is the mystery of so many mothers crying out and pleading that the lives of their children be spared from surrounding storms. How many mothers similarly feel the fatigue and desperation of drowning in the treacherous times that threaten so much harm to their children. Our Blessed Mother's reassurance is that her Son has indeed already paid a great price, an infinite ransom, by the laying down of his life so as to save souls from peril. The shrine continues to this day to be a site of constant pilgrimage with fleets of boats in particular sailing in procession so as to seek her protection from the tempests and churning waters of the Arabian sea.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God is love, and He revealed that love in sending His only Son to be a sacrificial offering for our sins. In these words from today's Epistle, we should hear an echo of the story of Abraham's offering of Isaac at the dawn of salvation history. Because Abraham obeyed God's command and did not withhold his only beloved



son, God promised that Abraham's descendants, the children of Israel, would be the source of blessing for all nations.

We see that promise coming to fulfillment in today's First Reading. God pours out His Spirit upon the Gentiles, the non-Israelites, as they listen to the word of Peter's preaching. Notice they receive the same gifts received by the devout Jews who heard Peter's preaching at Pentecost—the Spirit comes to rest upon them and they speak in tongues, glorifying God.

In His love today, God reveals that His salvation embraces the house of Israel and peoples of all nations. Not by circumcision or blood relation to Abraham but by faith in the Word of Christ, sealed in the Sacrament of Baptism, people are to be made children of Abraham, heirs to God's covenants of promise.

This is the wondrous work of God that we sing of in today's Psalm. It is the work of the Church, the good fruit that Jesus chooses and appoints His Apostles for in today's Gospel.

As Peter raises up Cornelius today, the Church continues to lift all eyes to Christ, the only one in whose name they can find salvation.

In the Church, each of us has been begotten by the love of God. But the Scriptures today reveal that this divine gift brings with it a command and a duty. We are to love one another as we have been loved. We are to lay down our lives in giving ourselves to others—that they too might find friendship with Christ and new life through Him.
