

- Spiritual Works of Mercy

On this Pentecost Sunday, to help shed light on deepening one's habitual practice of the spiritual works of mercy, the popular and trending example of elite power-lifter Vladimir "Anatoly" Shmondenko is useful. For those who have never heard of the diminutive but chiseled, compact muscle man, his many YouTube videos tell the whole story. Dressed as either a dutiful janitor or ill-suited fitness instructor, he approaches bodybuilders to inquire and comment on their exercise performance. Putting down his mop or clipboard, he asks to lift the same massive weight. The hulking men object to what seems an impossible and dangerous request. All onlookers are left dumbfounded as the unassuming, awkward and likeable Anatoly displays a phenomenal feat of strength beyond his apparent aptitude. The hidden camera captures well the comical and good-natured point that technique and intensive, regular training can go a long way in achieving impressive results.

So too ought the Catholic see the discipline of cultivating the interior life. While the more familiar and practiced corporal works of mercy (of charitably tending to the material needs of the destitute), the spiritual works of mercy can only be performed by those well-trained in the art of Christianity. To alleviate someone in their misery and impoverishment requires a sublime understanding and sensitivity well-balanced with a firmness and courage of knowing how to address the poison of sin. To treat another in spiritual sloth and ignorance, one has to be generously committed to a life of prayer and sacramental grace. To be able to correct and encourage, a Christian must be devout and battle-tested at having experienced and benefited for oneself from the gift of ongoing repentance and sanctification. The joy and consolation of being able to successfully intervene and to spiritually "punch beyond one's weight" is offered to those committed to life in the Holy Spirit.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost called all devout Jews to Jerusalem to celebrate their birth as God's chosen people in the covenant Law given to Moses at Sinai.

In today's First Reading, the mysteries prefigured in that feast are fulfilled in the pouring out of the Spirit on Mary and the Apostles.

The Spirit seals the new law and new covenant brought by Jesus, written not on stone tablets but on the hearts of believers, as the prophets promised.

The Spirit is revealed as the life-giving breath of the Father, the Wisdom by which He made all things, as we sing in today's Psalm.

In the beginning, the Spirit came as a "mighty wind" sweeping over the face of the earth. And in the new creation of Pentecost, the Spirit again comes as "a strong, driving wind" to renew the face of the earth. As God fashioned the first man out of dust and filled him with His Spirit, in today's Gospel we see the New Adam become a life-giving Spirit, breathing new life into the Apostles.

Like a river of living water, for all ages He will pour out His Spirit on His body, the Church, as we hear in today's Epistle.

We receive that Spirit in the sacraments, being made a "new creation" in Baptism.

Drinking of the one Spirit in the Eucharist, we are the first fruits of a new humanity—fashioned from out of every nation under heaven, with no distinctions of wealth or language or race, a people born of the Spirit.
