Virtues are formed by prayer. Prayer preserves temperance. Prayer suppresses anger. Prayer prevents emotions of pride and envy. Prayer draws into the soul the Holy Spirit, and raises man to Heaven.

#### St. Ephrem, (+373), Doctor of the Church, Feast Day, June 9

The fourth century world of St. Ephrem, rooted in the middle-eastern land of Syria/Turkey, inherited the remnants of the once powerful Chaldean/Persian empires. With the saving proclamation of Jesus Christ by the early Church, Christians had the formidable challenge in confronting the rivaling philosophies and idols established over the centuries. Ordained as a deacon to assist the local Bishop of Edessa, St. Ephrem contributed through sermons, poems and hymns to combat against the mendacious heresies that impeded the spread of the Gospel. His prodigious works indicate that he used his chance to be heard; he was known for blending sound dogma with an understandable prose. St. Ephrem eventually withdrew to a demanding life of hermetical asceticism to dedicate himself even further to prayer and composition. He wanted to form within his fellow Christians an invincible strategy of faithful, loving resistance to the constant under-pressure, compliance to the falsehoods that would promise liberation yet leave all too many, dead inside.

As depicted in the cited quote, St. Ephrem wanted to uproot inherent sinful tendencies that would lead to the trap of being caged in the all-too-familiar endless rules of cheating, lying, and covering up; rather, he promoted constant prayer. In our own spiritual battles, we too face the barrage of unwinding conspiracies that tempt us to slam shut our minds and stay hypnotized. Those well established in the spiritual life know all too well that the mere accumulation of knowledge is insufficient for feeling safe and secure; how easy it is to forget what one needs to remember. Preferably, the habit of prayer trains us to remain open to grace and wait patiently for a sign. The adoption of the same contemplative strategy is available to us to counter all the inciting and brainwashing tactics of a new world order globalist plot. To the puppeteering handler voices that propose only the madness of a materialist worldview of a boundless gloom, prayer encourages us to dig down, find faith and fight to make things right through openness to the gifts of the Holy Spirit. And so, the Church remains grateful for exemplary teachers, like St. Ephrem, who have done their part in fueling our hopes and expectations and have encouraged us to not miss the opportunity to be a better man.

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's Gospel Jesus has just been healing and casting out demons in Galilee. Along with the crowds, who flock to Him so that He can't even take a break to eat, come people who do not understand what He is doing. Even His friends think He has lost His mind and needs



to be taken away for a while. But the scribes who came down from Jerusalem are not just honestly mistaken; they accuse Him of being possessed by the prince of demons.

The reality is just the opposite. Jesus is revealing Himself as the one promised in our first reading. He is the seed of the woman who has come to crush the head of the demonic serpent. In the parable of the strong man, Jesus reveals that He has come not just to punish the devil but to free those bound by him. As St. Bede explains, "The Lord has also bound the strong man, that is, the devil: which means, He has restrained him from seducing the elect, and entering into his house, the world; He has spoiled his house, and His goods, that is men, because He has snatched them from the snares of the devil, and has united them to His Church."

The scribes blaspheme by attributing this work of the Holy Spirit to demons. Jesus adds a statement that shocks us at first: "whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness." That does not mean that there are any limits to the mercy of God (CCC 1864). Rather, the only sin that cannot be forgiven is the deliberate refusal to accept the mercy offered through the Holy Spirit.

Instead, we must imitate those who sat at Jesus' feet. For, as He said, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother."
