Let us see if his words are true, and let us test what will happen at the end of his life; for if the righteous man is God's child, he will help him, and will deliver him from the hand of his adversaries. Book of Wisdom 2. 17-18

The cited verses are a snippet of the lengthier Scripture portion of the first reading for this XXVth Sunday of Ordinary Time. Together with the prophecy of the Suffering Servant from Isaiah proclaimed every Good Friday, they offer the most compelling Old Testament prediction of the violently brutal and despicably unjust trial fulfilled in Jesus' Passion. Because of the calculated malice levied against the righteous, all faithful disciples of the Christ can identify with and claim some share in the distorted sense of fairness and directed hostility; perseverance against the sabotaging and undermining tactics of the wicked is surely one of life's harshest tests.


One of the more common ways our good intentions and reputations are attacked is through bearing and confronting falsehood and lies. The Catechism of the Catholic Church offers illuminating commentary in the section of "Offenses against Truth" (2475-2487). In clarifying key distinctions between rash judgment (assuming as true some moral fault of a neighbour without sufficient foundation), detraction (disclosing the hidden faults of a neighbour to others without valid reason), calumny (remarks contrary to the truth that do grave damage to the reputation of another- also includes defamation, libel and slander – depending on whether they appear in print, or broadcast media).

Regardless of whatever form of injury done to one's right to uphold one's good name and standing, a Christian ought to expect and brace for some kind of maligned assault as the cost of discipleship. Even more so, every Christian ought to examine conscience so as to ensure that they are never complicit in ruining the reputation of another. Ultimately, this Sunday's gospel reading will offer Jesus' invitation to humility and childlike trust as a sure strategy to survive the realities of spiritual warfare.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's First Reading, it's like we have our ears pressed to the wall and can hear the murderous grumblings of the elders, chief priests, and scribes—who last week Jesus predicted would torture and kill Him.

The liturgy invites us to see this passage from the Book of Wisdom as a prophecy of the Lord's Passion. We hear His enemies complain that "the Just One" has challenged their



And we hear chilling words that foreshadow how they will mock Him as He hangs on the Cross: "For if the Just One be the Son of God, He will . . . deliver Him . . . ".

Today's Gospel and Psalm give us the flip side of the First Reading. In both, we hear of Jesus' sufferings from His point of view. Though His enemies surround Him, He offers Himself freely in sacrifice, trusting that God will sustain Him.

But the Apostles today don't understand this second announcement of Christ's Passion. They begin arguing over issues of succession—over who among them is greatest, who will be chosen to lead after Christ is killed.

Again they are thinking not as God but as human beings. And again Jesus teaches the Twelve—the chosen leaders of His Church—that they must lead by imitating His example of love and self-sacrifice. They must be "servants of all," especially the weak and the helpless —symbolized by the child He embraces and places in their midst.

This is a lesson for us, too. We must have the mind of Christ, who humbled Himself to come among us. We must freely offer ourselves, making everything we do a sacrifice in praise of His name.

As James says in today's Epistle, we must seek wisdom from above, desiring humility, not glory, and in all things be gentle and full of mercy.
