h the obvious overtone of Our Lord's reference to the grain of wheat saying, Jimmy has very much earned the right to echo the gospel passage. For those unfamiliar with heroism of this noble Hong Konger, his current suffering and bold witness are as sigcant as any of the great martyrs of history. Born in 1948, his parents were disposed of their wealth from the rise of Chairman Mao's Communist Party of China and t into labour camps. As an 8 year old, Jimmy Lai was working as a baggage handler at ain station when a man dressed in a distinguished suit tipped the young boy with a colate bar. Jimmy was so enthralled with the taste of the treat that he already started aming of escaping to Hong Kong once the kind businessman told him of his native in. At 12 years of age, he hid as a stowaway on a fishing boat and immediately behe enamored with the frenetic paced streets of Hong Kong. He found employment in textile industry. Learning to speak English and being naturally gifted as a skilled neator, Jimmy was so good at salesmanship that he started bartering deals with foreign kets. He loved his travels to London, Paris, and New York and harnessed and consolied the hardworking, competitive productivity of his beloved citizens to form a lucraclothing line. He named his fashion enterprise after a pizza place he enjoyed in Chio, Giordano's. In the meantime, his exposure to the broader world and his marriage to Catholic wife, led to his own baptism and love of Jesus Christ and His Church. Factors h as the Tiananmen Square protests (1989) and the expiry of the 99 year British lease 97) led Jimmy Lai to found his media company (Next Media and Apple Daily) and he ted publishing his own editorial comments regarding China's overreach into Hong ng's sovereignty. The initially proposed policy of a one nation with two systems agreent soon saw encroachment and violation from the CCP. Million person marches in the vntown streets of Hong Kong were outlawed as threats to National Security. Jimmy was seen as the primary culprit for Hong Kong's David vs. Goliath peaceful reance to the CCP's tyranny. He is currently in prison in solitary confinement having his needlessly and sadistically drawn out. While some embassies have petitioned Beijing Jimmy Lai's release, the fear of economic retribution causes most nations and NGO's emain silent in the face of this brutal human rights violation. Jimmy Lai has received onditional support from the Cardinal emeritus of Hong Kong, the noble Joseph Zen. dinal Zen has pleaded with Pope Francis to intervene, especially as of recent with the P denying the now weakened 76 year-old Jimmy Lai the right to be ministered to by a st for Holy Communion. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The sons of Zebedee hardly know what they're asking in today's Gospel. They are thinking in terms of how the Gentiles rule, of royal privileges and honors. But the road to Christ's kingdom is by way of His Cross. To share in His glory, we must be willing to drink the cup that He drinks.



The cup is an Old Testament image for God's judgment. The

wicked would be made to drink this cup in punishment for their sins. But Jesus has come to drink this cup on behalf of all humanity. He has come to be baptized—which means plunged or immersed—into the sufferings we all deserve for our sins.

In this He will fulfill the task of Isaiah's suffering servant, whom we read about in today's First Reading.

Like Isaiah's servant, the Son of Man will give His life as an offering for sin, as once Israel's priests offered sacrifices for the sins of the people.

Jesus is the heavenly high priest of all humanity, as we hear in today's Epistle. Israel's high priests offered the blood of goats and calves in the temple sanctuary. But Jesus entered the heavenly sanctuary with His own blood.

And by bearing our guilt and offering His life to do the will of God, Jesus ransomed "the many"—paying the price to redeem humanity from spiritual slavery to sin and death.

He has delivered us from death, as we rejoice in today's Psalm.

We need to hold fast to our confession of faith, as today's Epistle exhorts us. We nust look upon our trials and sufferings as our portion of the cup He promised to hose who believe in Him. We must remember that we have been baptized into His passion and death.

In confidence, let us approach the altar today, the throne of grace, at which we drink the cup of His saving blood.
