Let us not desire delights, daughters; we are well-off here; the bad inn lasts for only a night. Let us praise God; let us force ourselves to do penance in this life. How sweet will be the death of one who has done penance for all his sins, of one who won't have to go to purgatory! Even from here below you can begin to enjoy glory! You will find no fear within yourself but complete peace.

St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582), from her work, The Way of Perfection

As we enter into the spirituality of the month of November, a visit from this Doctor of the Church can be of great help in addressing anxieties and fears over the final things. Writing to her fellow Carmelite nuns, St. Teresa offers the analogy of a life burdened with hardship and difficulties to the disappointment of spending a miserable night in a horrible hotel. The vivid and familiar illustration can provide a modern audience with the same motivation by which it fueled her fellow sisters. Who is not well-acquainted with the experience of scrolling and comparing potential hotel stays on well-liked apps such as kayak, expedia, or airbnb? Part of the vacation fun is already weighing and sifting through the available options of resort features such as location, parking, outdoor pool, happy hours, and buffet breakfasts. The annoyance when well-researched plans do not meet the advertised expectation invoke indignation but are usually not worth the hassle of trying to seek compensation. St. Teresa of Avila instructs wisely to see all things in the light of eternity. Classically speaking, any suffering endured in this life ought to be interpreted as: atonement for one's sins, strengthening against a bad habit, the testing of the quality of an acquired virtue, or the gaining of heavenly merit for enduring courageously an evil over time. St. Teresa, and her fellow Carmelites, specialized in the agony and ecstasy of knowing their hidden sacrifices were serving the salvation of souls and obtaining good for the needs of the Church.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Love is only law we are to live by. And love is the fulfillment of the Law that God reveals through Moses in today's First Reading (see <u>Romans 13:8–10</u>; <u>Matthew 5:43</u>–48).



The unity of God—the truth that He is one God, Father, Son, and Spirit—means that we must love Him with one love, a love that serves Him with all our hearts and minds, souls and strength.

We love Him because He has loved us first. We love our neighbor because we can't love the God we haven't seen unless we love those made in His image and likeness, whom we have seen (see 1 John 4:19–21).

And we are called to imitate the love that Christ showed us in laying His life down on the Cross (see 1 John 3:16). As we hear in today's Epistle, by His perfect sacrifice on the Cross, He once and for all makes it possible for us to approach God.

There is no greater love than to lay down your life (see <u>John 15:13</u>). This is perhaps why Jesus tells the scribe in today's Gospel that he is not far from the kingdom of God.

The scribe recognizes that the burnt offerings and sacrifices of the old Law were meant to teach Israel that it is love that God desires (see <u>Hosea 6:6</u>). The animals offered in sacrifice were symbols of the self-sacrifice, the total gift of our selves, that God truly desires.

We are called today to examine our hearts. Do we have other loves that get in the way of our love for God? Do we love others as Jesus has loved us (see <u>John 13:34–35</u>)? Do we love our enemies and pray for those who oppose and persecute us (see <u>Matthew 5:44</u>)?

Let us tell the Lord we love Him, as we do in today's Psalm. And let us take His Word to heart, that we might prosper and have life eternal in His kingdom, the heavenly homeland flowing with milk and honey.
