But when we move into the time of Abraham, we're talking about Semitic nomads speaking languages that are totally unlike English, that are written backwards from the way that we're used to. They're wandering around visiting cities that we no longer remember, engaging with cultures that we never talk about nowadays, like the Hittites or the Perizzites and things like this. It is very much more foreign to us, and I think that's part of the factor of intimidating people from really getting into the Old Testament.

While there has been some recent high-profile conversions to the Catholic Church, (Shia LaBeouf, Candace Owens, J.D. Vance, Tammy Peterson - Jordan's wife), the phenomena of those seeking full sacramental communion has not been limited to celebrities who have limited theological understanding. Rather, biblical scholars from evangelical streams have also found their way to Rome. Most notably within the Christian world, Dr. Scott Hahn, Eric Sammons, and Steven Ray have contributed their significant knowledge to become leaders of lay apostolates. The author of the cited quote from Dr. John Bergsma is another of such notable converts. With top rank academic credentials in Old Testament research, this former Protestant Pastor is now not only teaching at Steubenville College but is trying to aid a wider audience of those interested in Biblical studies to have access to good teachers. The St. Paul Center for Biblical Studies provides numerous online high quality resources to make the daunting work of diving deep into history, language, and culture of the ancient world less intimidating. Together with Dr. Scott Hahn as President, the institute has a comprehensive approach and abundant materials to nourish those with a passion for Sacred Scripture – including a weekly Sunday Gospel reflection to help pray up for the upcoming Sunday readings; once you get into it, you may realize how familiar it all looks, sounds and feels. Back in 2019, Pope Francis promulgated that the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time is to be "Word of God" Sunday throughout the Catholic world. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The meaning of today's liturgy is subtle and many-layered. We need background to understand what's happening in today's First Reading. Babylon having been defeated, King Cyrus of Persia decreed that the exiled Jews could return home to Jerusalem. They rebuilt their ruined temple and under Nehemiah finished rebuilding the city walls..



The stage was set for the renewal of the covenant and the reestablishment of the Law of Moses as the people's rule of life. That's what's going on in today's First Reading, as Ezra reads and interprets the Law and the people respond with a great "Amen!"

Israel, as we sing in today's Psalm, is rededicating itself to God and His Law. The scene seems like the Isaiah prophecy that Jesus reads from in today's Gospel.

Read all of Isaiah 61. The "glad tidings" Isaiah brings include these promises: the liberation of prisoners (61:1); the rebuilding of Jerusalem, or Zion; the restoration of Israel as a kingdom of priests; and the forging of an everlasting covenant. It sounds a lot like the First Reading.

Jesus, in turn, declares that Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in Him. The Gospel scene, too, recalls the First Reading. Like Ezra, Jesus stands before the people, is handed a scroll, unrolls it, then reads and interprets it.

We witness in today's Liturgy the creation of a new people of God. Ezra started reading at dawn of the first day of the Jewish new year. Jesus also proclaims a "sabbath," a great year of Jubilee, a deliverance from slavery to sin, a release from the debts we owe to God.

The people greeted Ezra "as one man." And, as today's Epistle teaches, in the Spirit the new people of God—the Church—is made "one body" with Him.
