We remain your loyal soldiers, yet we are also the faithful servants of the true God. While we will obey in all that's just, we cannot bear the guilt of shedding innocent blood. We've witnessed our brethren's sacrifice and honor their martyrdom. We bear arms, yet we won't resist. We'd rather meet an honorable death than live in sin. - St. Mauritius, 3rd century Martyr

At this point in the winter season, some help is needed in coping with the weariness of cold, ice and snow. The inspiration of St. Mauritius can be of invigorating assistance in that invernal cause. St. Mauritius originated from the ancient city of Thebes, deep in the heart of Egypt on the banks of the Nile river. As a Christian, he served in the Roman Empire and commanded a legion of men. While on deployment in the city of Geneva, Switzerland, his faith in Christ led to an extraordinary showdown. He was ordered to investigate a group of Christians accused of insubordination. He found no wrong in their actions or shared beliefs and refused to carry out any of the commanded punishments. As a test of loyalty, the Roman Emperor demanded that Mauritius pay tribute to the Roman gods in sacrifice. Mauritius refused and was subsequently executed along with his faithful Christian soldiers. The story of defiance and heroism spread throughout the region as St. Mauritius was admired not only for his courage but his manliness as a dark-skinned Egyptian, hailing from the scorching Nile Delta, who braved the harsh, snowy mountainous terrain of the Alps. Accordingly, numerous monasteries in the surrounding French, Italian, Austrian region (St. Maurice, San Maurizio) adopted his patronage. Perhaps no place is more famous than the uber splendid town of St. Moritz, in east Switzerland. Access to this winter wonderland can be had via the panoramic "glacier express" train ride. The town that has hosted 2 Winter Olympics offers the best of ski resorts and winter sports (including horse racing and polo on ice), boutique hotels, 5 star restaurants, horse drawn sleigh rides, majestic gondola ascents, thrilling luge/tobogganing runs, mineral spring/thermal spas, exquisite European wines, and local liquors and fine chocolates. Mardi Gras in Rio, Venice or New Orleans may have its perks but St. Moritz sparkles this time of year. While travel to a St. Moritz may have to remain on a bucket list of fantastical revery, an online video visit may be at least a sufficient teaser to tickle at the February doldrums. Regardless, knowing the inspiration and story of St. Moritz stirs within us a fascination of our Christian history and culture so very much needed in our day.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Simon Peter, the fisherman, is the first to be called personally by Jesus in Luke's Gospel.

His calling resembles Isaiah's commissioning in the First Reading: confronted with the holiness of the Lord, both Peter and Isaiah are overwhelmed by a sense of their own sinfulness and inadequacy. Yet each experiences the Lord's forgiveness and is sent to preach the good news of His mercy to the world.



No one is "fit to be called an apostle," Paul recognizes in today's Epistle. But by "the grace of God," even a persecutor of the Church—as Paul once was—can be lifted up for the Lord's service.

In the Old Testament, humanity was unfit for the divine—no man could stand in God's presence and live. But in Jesus, we're made able to speak with Him face-to-face, to taste His Word on our tongue.

Today's scene from Isaiah is recalled in every Mass. Before reading the Gospel, the priest silently asks God to cleanse his lips that he might worthily proclaim His Word.

God's Word comes to us as it came to Peter, Paul, Isaiah, and today's Psalmist—as a personal call to leave everything and follow Him, to surrender our weaknesses in order to be filled with His strength.

Simon put out into deep waters even though, as a professional fisherman, he knew it would be foolhardy to expect to catch anything. In humbling himself before the Lord's command, he was exalted—his nets filled to overflowing; later, as Paul tells us, he will become the first to see the risen Lord.

Jesus has made us worthy to receive Him in the company of angels in God's holy Temple. On our knees like Peter, with the humility of David in today's Psalm, we thank Him with all our hearts and join in the unending hymn that Isaiah heard around God's altar: "Holy, holy, holy..."

Western Region: Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, Etobicoke; St. Mary's Parish, Brampton

Eastern Region: St. Barnabas Parish, Scarborough; St. Gregory the Great Parish, Oshawa

Northern Region: St. Padre Pio Parish, Kleinburg; St. Mary's Parish, Barrie Shrine: Martyrs' Shrine, Midland

8. What about people who cannot make a pilgrimage or visit a Designated Jubilee Pilgrimage Site? How can they receive the Jubilee Indulgence?

Many people, including the elderly, the sick, prisoners, and others are not capable of making a pilgrimage or visiting a Designated Jubilee Pilgrimage Site during the Jubilee Year. We are reminded in these circumstances that God's mercy extends to all people. Thus, the confined person is called to unite in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, especially when the words of the Pope or the Bishop are transmitted through means of communication.
