

While the names of Marx, Lenin, Trotsky, Engels, Stalin are among the more familiar characters associated with the spread of atheistic socialism, the Sardinian born Antonio Gramsci, though lesser known, has had an equally profound detrimental impact upon Western history. Whereas the other cited communists hailed from Russian and German backgrounds with their embittered battles against Christianity, Gramsci better understood the galvanizing and stabilizing effect that Catholicism signified for his native country. This sickly and diminutive Italian raged against the feudal system of wealthy landowners who held decisive advantage over impoverished labourers. As a student, Antonio Gramsci was gifted enough to earn a scholarship to the University of Turin. In his studies and contacts, he was recruited into communist circles rippling their way through Europe. The economic revolution proposed by Karl Marx, in Antonio's opinion, did not go far enough. Beyond a class war between bourgeoisie and proletariat, Antonio recognized that foundational social structures like the Church, its liturgical calendar, family life, catholic education also needed to be infiltrated in order to dismantle the traditional hierarchical order. He helped coin the phrase, "the long march through the institutions." His newspaper writings drew the attention of the Fascist Mussolini regime and he was imprisoned. While incarcerated, he continued to expand his thought in a journal. His weakened health further deteriorated from the meager diet and cold conditions of his sentence. His writing was discovered and translated after WWII and he is credited with having laid the groundwork for "critical theory" that is so pervasively embedded into the public sphere. There is quiet testimony of his deathbed conversion but his pernicious thought has been usurped broadly. As Catholics, the study of such history is important. We have a vital task of discerning truth from the barrage of hostile attacks against the faith. We ought to recognize not only the external threats we face but be sufficiently grounded in the Churches' social teaching so as to address adeptly the political/ideological disputes of our day. We seek to fulfill our noble mission of drawing all into the sovereign reign of Jesus Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The story of David and Saul in today's First Reading functions almost like a parable. Showing mercy to his deadly foe, David gives a concrete example of what Jesus expects to become a way of life for His disciples.

The new law Jesus gives in today's Gospel would have us all become "Davids"—loving our enemies, doing good to



The Old Law required only that the Israelites love their fellow countrymen. The new law Jesus brings makes us kin to every man and woman. His kingdom isn't one of tribe or nationality. It's a family. As followers of Jesus, we're to live as He lived among us—as "children of the Most High".

As sons and daughters, we want to walk in the ways of our heavenly Father, to "be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." Grateful for His mercy, we're called to forgive others their trespasses because God has forgiven ours.

In the context of today's liturgy, we're all "Sauls"—by our sinfulness and pride we make ourselves enemies of God. But we've been spared a death we surely deserved to die because God has loved and shown mercy to His enemies, "the ungrateful and the wicked," as Jesus says.

Jesus showed us this love in His Passion, forgiving His enemies as they stripped Him of cloak and tunic, cursed Him and struck Him on the cheek, condemned Him to death on a cross (see Luke 22:63–65; 23:34). "He redeems your life from destruction," David reminds us in today's Psalm.

That's the promise, too, of today's Epistle: that we who believe in the "last Adam," Jesus, will rise from the dead in His image, as today we bear the image of the "first Adam," who by his sin made God an enemy and brought death into the world.
