I am decidedly and unapologetically Catholic. It is this faith that has been the guiding beacon during some difficult and seemingly hopeless times, even when I had turned my heart against Him and turned my back on faith. I have no doubt that this faith will do the same for each of you if you let it, and perhaps even if you don't. It is not a tether. Rather, it is a guide.

Clarence Thomas, (longest serving American Supreme Court Judge) address to students of Christendom College

On the second Sunday of Lent, the liturgy invites us to pause and reflect upon the mystery of the Transfiguration on the way to Calvary. The inspiring story of the life of Clarence Thomas offers a comparable parallel of intermingled tastes of glory in the midst of formidable struggle. Born in 1948, in the city of Savannah, Georgia, his childhood was marked by all the social upheaval and poverty of the fallout from slavery and racial segregation. His parents, being unable to care for him, entrusted the young Clarence's care to his Catholic grandfather, a rarity in the deep south of the bible belt. His grandfather insisted on shaping him in the harsh realities of life by insisting on hard work, physical exertion, and pushing him towards education. At Catholic school, the nuns taught him to not only read and write but encouraged him to persevere in the discipline of studies. He enrolled for formation in a minor seminary in Missouri and subsequently discerned to leave, following up with a scholarship to a university in the Boston area. Campus life entangled him in the bitter civil rights battles and Clarence's anger was ignited; he had to discern the best way forward to confront the disparity he witnessed. While the temptation to join the social activism movements of his day were strong, he felt a deeper call to the traditional faith of his upbringing as most effective to promote a God given equality and justice among men. Even after graduating with top grades from Yale law school, his initial challenge was to convince others that his success was not merely to attribute affirmative action incentives. A congressman noticed his intellect and talent and invited him to Washington where he gained further credibility. Under the presidency of George Bush, he was selected to serve as a federal judge and subsequently called to the Supreme Court. Because of Clarence's more conservative leanings, his nomination infuriated many. Throughout his tenure, he has put into practice an admirable sense of defending individual rights, promoting the common good, and refuting errors – all the while not succumbing to the poison of identity politics. As his stellar career comes to its conclusion, he still draws stinging criticism from his many detractors, yet he has manifested much needed wisdom and balance. As a devout Catholic, he does not shy away from expressing his gratitude for the many mercies and graces Our Lord has granted him.

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's Lenten Liturgy, the Church wants us to look back past Moses. Indeed, we are asked to contemplate what today's Epistle calls God's "design . . . from before time began."



With His promises to Abram in today's First Reading,

God formed the people through whom He would reveal Himself and bestow His blessings on all humanity.

He later elevated these promises to eternal covenants and changed Abram's name to Abraham, promising that he would be father of a host of nations. In remembrance of His covenant with Abraham he raised up Moses, and later swore an everlasting kingdom to David's sons.

In Jesus' transfiguration today, He is revealed as the One through whom God fulfills His divine plan from of old.

Not only a new Moses, Jesus is also the "beloved son" promised to Abraham and again to David.

Moses foretold a prophet like him to whom Israel would listen, and Isaiah foretold an anointed servant in whom God would be well pleased. Jesus is this prophet and this servant, as the voice on the mountain tells us today.

By faith we have been made children of the covenant with Abraham. He calls us, too, to a holy life, to follow His Son to the heavenly homeland He has promised. We know, as we sing in today's Psalm, that we who hope in Him will be delivered from death.

So like our father in faith, we go forth as the Lord directs us: "Listen to Him!"




