As meaning deteriorates in the modern world, as our value systems and institutions crumble, all of us become increasingly aware that there is this eerily familiar awakening and beckoning figure that we've all known all of our lives, within us and around us. And for me, it's very exciting. The reason I wear a cross is because Christianity and, in particular, the figure of Christ, are, it seems to me, inevitably becoming more important as I become more familiar with suffering, purpose, self, and not-self. Like many desperate people, I need spirituality. I need God, or I cannot cope in this world. I need to believe in the best in people. I didn't have enough self-discipline to resist the allure of stardom; I fell face-first into the glitter, and I'm only just pulling myself out now. - Russell Brand, English Actor and Podcaster

On this fourth Sunday of Lent, the gospel reading presents us with the classic parable of the Prodigal Son. The familiar narrative of restlessness, rebellion, reckless squandering, rock-bottoming, repentance and return is offered as an insightful echo into our own resistant hearts and as the ideal story line of conversion for those whom we hope would accept faith in Christ. The life of the now 48 year old Russel Brand fits the profile of the wayward lost soul who appears to have undergone a dramatic change from his former habits of decadence and profligacy. Details of his early childhood are typical of one who grew up with family breakdown; his exposure to promiscuity and substance abuse was as if encouraged by way of personal escape. His acting career was launched based on his capacity for outrageous behaviour. His reputation for scandal, depravity, misconduct and addiction has been publicly chronicled. His baptism, May 2024, in the Thames river in London offers a great sign of hope. His desire to combat his monstrous compulsions is being remedied through the prayer, especially of the Rosary. While he has not yet embraced the fullness of the Christian faith through reception into the Catholic Church, like any of the sinners the Church seeks to reconcile to herself in the Lenten season, prayers and pastoral care wanting his sobriety, safety, and sanctity are what this Sunday's parable best signifies.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Sunday readings in Lent have been showing us the high points of salvation history—God's covenant with creation in the time of Noah; His promises to Abraham; the law He gave to Israel at Sinai.

In today's First Reading, we hear of the destruction of the kingdom established by God's final Old Testament covenant—the covenant with David.

His chosen people abandoned the law He gave them. For their sins, the temple was destroyed, and they were exiled in Babylon. We hear their sorrow and repentance in the exile lament we sing as todav's Psalm.

But we also hear how God, in His mercy, gathered them back, even anointing a pagan king to shepherd them and rebuild the temple.

God is rich in mercy, as today's Epistle teaches. He promised that David's kingdom would last forever, that David's son would be His Son and rule all nations. In Jesus, God keeps that promise

Moses lifted up the serpent as a sign of salvation. Now Jesus is lifted up on the Cross, to draw all people to Himself.

Those who refuse to believe in this sign of the Father's love condemn themselves—as the Israelites in their infidelity brought judgment upon themselves.

But God did not leave Israel in exile, and He does not want to leave any of us dead in our transgressions. We are God's handiwork, saved to live as His people in the light of His truth.

Midway through this season of repentance, let us again behold the Pierced One and rededicate ourselves to living the "good works" fr. Rocer that God has prepared us for.
