Woe to he who trusts in mercy with the aim of sinning! How many this illusion had fooled and led into perdition! Woe to he who abuses the goodness of God to offend Him more!

- St. Augustine (354-430), Doctor of the Church

This deep into Lent, most parishes will be offering extended opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The beloved gospel of Jesus' defense of the publicly condemned adulterous woman is a great catalyst in helping even the most squeamish to overcome their hesitation of the vulnerability required in confessing one's sins. St. Augustine, in commenting on this particular episode, wrote long ago with poetic precision that in the end, there was only "misere and misericordia" left; the triumph of mercy over misery is a victory we seek to claim for our own broken lives. The traumatizing harm of a priest confessor who will communicate misdirected annoyance or frustration to a penitent can leave deep wounds of reluctance of ever returning back to the confessional.

And yet, the trap set for Jesus that day is one that many within the Church can also fall into. As Jesus was tested to see whether he would choose laxity of the Mosaic law with exemption of blame, so too will most soft interpretations of the woman caught in adultery focus almost exclusively on the imperative to "judge not lest you be judged." In fact, even the Holy See, in its October 2024 Synod of Synodality meeting, included in its penitential service the novel offense of using "doctrines as stones to be hurled." It could be wrongly understood that the whole problem with guilt and shame has to do with the moral law and teachings of the Church in the first place – as if commandments were too rigid and unrealistic. Consequently, the temptation to presumption is real – that one can take advantage of God to free oneself to commit the evil desired. Real mercy exists for those who respect and fear God's justice and appreciate that they have not been given license indefinitely to get away with their own sinful, selfish pursuits. An afflicted conscience knows it has offended God and cannot merit forgiveness by any other means than appealing to God's goodness. Accordingly, Jesus, in today's gospel, best exemplifies the healthy tension between pardon and admonition..."nor do I condemn you...from now on do not sin again." (Jn 8.11)

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Liturgy this Lent has shown us the God of the Exodus. He is a mighty and gracious God, Who out of faithfulness to His covenant has done "great things" for His people, as today's Psalm puts it.



But the "things of long ago," Isaiah tells us in today's First Reading, are nothing compared to the "something new" that He will do in the future.

Today's First Reading and Psalm look back to the marvelous deeds of the Exodus. Both see in the Exodus a pattern and prophecy of the future, when God will restore the fortunes of His people fallen in sin. The readings today look forward to a still greater Exodus, when God will gather in the exiled tribes of Israel that had been scattered to the four winds, the ends of the earth.

The new Exodus that Israel waited and hoped for has come in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Like the adulterous woman in today's Gospel, all have been spared by the Lord's compassion. All have heard His words of forgiveness, His urging to repentance, to be sinners no more. Like Paul in today's Epistle, Christ has taken possession of every one, claimed each as a child of our heavenly Father.

In the Church, God has formed a people for Himself to announce His praise, just as Isaiah said He would. And as Isaiah promised, He has given His "chosen people" living waters to drink in the desert wastelands of the world. But our God is ever a God of the future, not of the past. We are to live with hopeful hearts, "forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies

hopeful hearts, "forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead," as Paul tells us. His salvation, Paul says, is power in the present, "the power of His resurrection."

We are to live awaiting a still greater and final Exodus, pursuing "the goal, the prize of God's upward calling," striving in faith to attain the last new thing God promises—"the resurrection of the dead."
