-St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556)

Entering into Holy Week, the great Spaniard and founder of the Jesuit Order provides the accurate and dramatic context for what Our Lord accomplished as he entered into his Sacred Passion. St. Ignatius was wellpoised, from his personal perspective, to acknowledge that when one allows Christ to arrive on the scene, one's life is never quite the same; at the time of his dramatic conversion during recovery from a battle injury, Ignatius radically had his life turned upside down from one of court chivalry as a military infantryman to priest, mystic and noble defender of Catholicism. He resolutely fought great conflicts from the outside world, within the Church, and of the rugged terrain of his own heart. The natural and supernatural consequences may seem too jarring and disruptive to the status quo if God's justice and truth were to be firmly implemented. And yet, with the stakes so high, the definitive decision to push forward on what is good and right, regardless of all the frenzied resistance, is to be pursued with unflinching valour. The mounting and coordinated opposition that Jesus faced in the plotting against his life, his arrest, his trial and his execution would have one think that his enemies have been carefully strategizing their tactics with meticulous rehearsing. Obviously, one can note the same parallel dynamics of provoking infernal rage at comparable attempts of confronting, tackling, and dismantling any of the false idols and wicked ideologies that plague our modern culture. Indeed, the infinite good of the gift of redemption that Christ will victoriously seize will come at a great cost to himself by inciting nothing less than full demonic fury. How admirable and worthy of worship it is to lend our full attention and time to following along with the liturgical movements of the week. We pray that we may grow in courage and heroism so as to persevere in whatever formidable spiritual combat to which we have been summoned.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Yet another Holy Week is on our doorsteps. We are preparing for a series of events that will unfold in rapid succession-Jesus' anointing at Bethany, the last supper, Gethsemane, his arrest, trial before the Sanhedrin, Peter's denial, trial before



Pilate, his crucifixion, Jesus body laid in the tomb, the resurrection and appearances to his followers; quite a series of events.

Everything happens during Holy Week and you will experience a gamut of emotions from despair to elation, sadness to Joy, disappointment and Hope, shock and awe, defeat and victory. It mirrors our own life. There is something in the whole Holy Week story for all of us.

Allow Holy Week to wash over you like a wave at the shore. Walk with Jesus and reflects on the meaning of his passion, death and resurrection in your life. Experience his saving grace, open your heart to his love and rise with him to newness of life.

Please pray for our 18 candidates who will receive the sacraments of initiation that they will learn to love and serve he Lord with passion and diligence.

SHARELIFE


