The true namesake of the Victorious Resurrection are you called, O Martyr of Christ, who were victorious over your enemies with patience, on behalf of Christ, your Bridegroom, Whom you loved, Pray to save our Souls.

When they that are found in trials and adversities flee unto thy Church O Anastasia, they receive the august and wondrous gifts of Divine Grace which doth abide in thee; for at all times, O Saint of God, thou pourest forth streams of healing for the world.

O Lord Jesus, unto Thee Thy lamb doth cry with a great voice: O my Bridegroom, Thee I love; and seeking Thee, I now contest, and with Thy baptism am crucified and buried. I suffer for Thy sake, that I may reign with Thee; for Thy sake I die, that I may live in Thee: accept me offered out of longing to Thee as a spotless sacrifice. Lord, save our souls through her intercessions, since Thou art great in mercy.

The women in the gospel accounts of the crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus are noted for their presence and tending to Our Lord where the others choose to run and hide. Taking their place at the foot of the cross and heading to the tomb to anoint his tortured body are great signs of devotion and affection. St. Anastasia, during her brief life, comparably fulfilled that same loving and noble mission. Perhaps the least recognizable name of the women mentioned in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic prayer I), her name literally means "resurrection" and her actual feast day on the liturgical calendar is hidden away on December 25. And yet, her heroic legacy was so significant that her intercession was sought within the celebration of mass. She lived during the time of Roman persecution under the emperor Diocletian. She was known for visiting imprisoned Christians and bringing them material and spiritual support. Numerous attempts to coerce her to renounce her faith were defeated by her resolve - even escaping plots against her life until she was eventually martyred. In contrast to the depictions of a feminism that is hostile to Christianity by so many of our contemporaries, the witness of St. Anastasia offers the beauty and strength of a femininity that embraces, adores and serves the glorious Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The prophet Daniel in a vision saw "One like the Son of Man" receive everlasting kingship (see Daniel 7:9–14). John is taken to heaven in today's Second Reading where he sees Daniel's prophecy fulfilled in Jesus, who appears as "One like a Son of Man."

Jesus is clad in the robe of a High Priest (see Exodus 28:4; Wisdom 18:24) and wearing the gold sash of a king (see 1 Maccabees 10:89). He has been exalted by the right hand of the Lord, as we sing in today's Psalm.

His risen body, which the Apostles touch in today's Gospel, has been made a lifegiving Spirit (see 1 Corinthians 15:45).

As the Father anointed Him with the Spirit and power (see Acts 10:38), Jesus pours out that Spirit on the Apostles, sending them into the world "as the Father has sent Me." Jesus "breathes" the Spirit of His divine life into the Apostles—as God blew the "breath of life" into Adam (see Genesis 2:7), as Elijah's prayer returned "the life breath" to the dead child (see 1 Kings 17:21–23), and as the Spirit breathed new life into the slain in the valley of bones (see Ezekiel 37:9–10).

His creative breath unites the Apostles—His Church—to His body, and empowers them to breathe His life into a dying world, to make it a new creation.

In today's Gospel and First Reading, we see the Apostles fulfilling this mission with powers only God possesses—the power to forgive sins and to work "signs and wonders," a biblical expression only used to describe the mighty works of God (see Exodus 7:3; 11:10; Acts 7:36).

Thomas and the others saw "many other signs" after Jesus was raised from the dead. They saw and they believed.

They have been given His life, which continues in the Church's Word and sacraments, so that we who have not seen might inherit His blessings and "have life in His name." **F. Roge**
