The days of Easter are to celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death and the ongoing, unfolding implications of that glorious triumph. The season of Easter is also the time to celebrate those recently baptized and encourage the "neophytes" to progress in their faith formation and to deepen in their marvel and understanding of the Christian mystery (mystagogy). The multi-award winning actor, Denzel Washington, is now included in the ranks of the baptized. From his birthplace north of the Bronx, his life pivoted in his late teens; following his parents divorce, his enrollment in post-secondary education, led him to acting rather than follow the course of street violence like so many of his peers. His unquestionable talent is evident from the many diverse roles he has excelled in: historical champions of civil rights activism (Crv Freedom, Malcolm X, The Great Debaters...). menacing villains (American Gangster, Training Day, Flight...), lead action film heroes (Book of Eli, Man on Fire, Manchurian Candidate, Equalizer) - all his portrayals convey his signature no-nonsense, on screen intensity and formidable presence. Denzel's theatrical roles portray a courageous man of no compromise whose skill, toughness, and street-smarts allow him to confront treache/ rous and wicked antagonists. His various interviews speak of his sincere effort at not being dragged into the mire of Hollywood filth. And so, his acting life mirrored his personal life with his decision, just shy of his 70th birthday, to be plunged into the saving waters of baptism. His father was a Pentecostal minister and undoubtedly the complex layers of his paternal relationship has both disturbed and intrigued him throughout all his career success. As Catholics, we can pray and applaud Denzel Washington's perseverance in where our good Lord is leading him and hope the well-liked actor & Christian grows in the fullness of truth of God's revelation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

glimpsed in today's Second Reading.

There are two places in Scripture where the curious detail of a rom the "charcoal fire" is mentioned. Pastor's desk One is in today's Gospel, where the Apostles return from fishing to find bread and fish warming on the fire. The other is in the scene in the High Priest's courtyard on Holy Thursday, where Peter and some guards and slaves warm themselves while Jesus is being interrogated inside (see John 18:18). At the first fire, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times, as Jesus had predicted (see John 13:38; 18:15-18, 25-27). Today's charcoal fire becomes the scene of Peter's repentance, as three times Jesus asks him to make a profession of love. Jesus' thrice repeated command "feed My sheep" shows that Peter is being appointed as the shepherd of the Lord's entire flock, the head of His Church. Jesus' question: "Do you love me more than these?" is a pointed reminder of Peter's pledge to lay down his life for Jesus, even if the other Apostles might weaken. Jesus then explains just what Peter's love and leadership will require, foretelling Peter's death by crucifixion ("you will stretch out your hands"). Before His own death, Jesus had warned the Apostles that they would be hated as He was hated, that they would suffer as He suffered; John 15:18-20; 16:2). We see the beginnings of that persecution in today's First Reading. Flogged as Jesus was, the Apostles nonetheless leave "rejoicing that they have been found worthy to suffer.' Their joy is based on their faith that God will change their "mourning into dancing," as we sing in today's Psalm. By their sufferings, the know, they will be counted worthy to stand in heaven before "the Lamb that was slain," a scene
