The renowned French novelist offers us a concise and precise truth to focus our Mothers' Day devotion. Writing in the aftermath of the French Revolution, Victor Hugo's classic tale of Paris' famous landmark, the storied cathedral of Notre-Dame, gives witness to the abiding and loving presence of a Mother who seeks to offer her children safety, nourishment and guidance during troubled times. Of all the complex characters that make up the well-known narrative, Quasimodo stands out most. In his grotesque deformities, the hunchback brute was left orphaned and abandoned in the cathedral; he was taken in, provided with care and tasked with the key responsibility of being the watchman and operator of the Cathedral's reverberating bells; he excelled in both assignments. On account of his ugly, disfigured appearance, Quasimodo took solitary refuge with the company of the statues of saints, kings, and gargoyles; rejected by his contemporaries, he spent long hours in the comfort of Mother Church. For those familiar with the novel, an enduring scene is when the unruly mob, stirred up by agitators, descends upon Notre-Dame seeking to rescue the young heroine, Esmeralda. Believing the hoards are intent on doing harm to the Church, Quasimodo defends Notre-Dame passionately. Perched high from her upper balustrades, Quasimodo thwarts the manic efforts of the vandals who seek to ram their way in through the Cathedral's main doors with a retaliatory barrage of stones, wooden beams and molten led rained down from above. It is at this climax moment that the most catharsis is unleashed. For all the sacrilegious abuse and blasphemy that the hallowed Cathedral endured, echoing back to the "reforms" of the Revolution, Quasimodo emerges as a fierce defender of the faith and instrument of Our Lord's wrath for those who scorn the gift of his daughter, mother and bride, Notre-Dame. Who would not want to defend and be the retributive warrior for acts of aggression upon Our Lady? Throughout all the violence, sin, and chaos of Victor Hugo's famed novel, Notre-Dame, then and now, stands as witness to the rejection and rebellion of her children. She firmly and patiently summons her children back to calm and grace. With her grand reopening this past feast of the Immaculate Conception, may the important mission of Notre-Dame continue to restore the citizens of Paris and the many international pilgrims who dawn her doors. For all those searching to rediscover the Churches' maternal care, her glorious past and her providential wisdom, may they know Notre-Dame's extraordinary intercession and tenderness.
