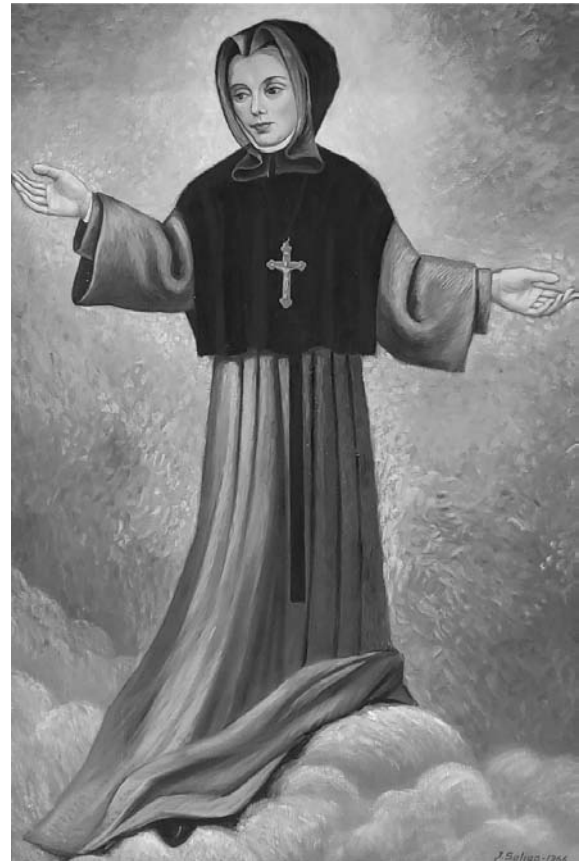

I felt that if I refused this opportunity, I would not be able to look myself in the mirror knowing that I could have saved the lives of countless children.

Beyond the supercharged atmosphere of American politics, Robert Kennedy Jr.'s story is dramatic, inspiring, and indicative of so many of the Catholics of his baby boomer generation. While acknowledging the wise warning of Scripture of not putting one's trust in princes and staying clear of party affiliation, that Bobby Kennedy Jr. finds himself in his current improbable position of authority and oversight is amazing. Especially considering his high profile background. He was 15 years of age when his father was assassinated; obviously, the suspect and shady circumstances of his uncle's death already plunged the family into trauma and mistrust. Though the onetime strong Kennedy family was steeped in devout Catholic piety (daily mass, rosary, reading bible stories and the lives of saints), much changed when the recurring vicious tragedies were seen as targeted malice against their faithfulness and decency. Robert Kennedy Jr. fell into the vice of drug addiction to cope with his pain and charted a path of relational turbulence in the dissolution of numerous marriages. In fact, to this day, he is still sorting out questions of orthodox Catholic morality. Nonetheless, it is noteworthy that his professional credentials, and his hidden years of study and research, are causing an earthquake to longtime entrenched positions on health care and diet. The likelihood of him ever having risen to this opportunity are too staggering to calculate as he faced the fiercest of opposition. Consequently, one can not help but interpret the spectacular immensity of a Providential plan and humble prayers answered that current and generational wrongs are starting to be confronted and corrected.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

John's gospel which is considered "high" theology is the star attraction of Easter. This weekend it reaches new heights. John presents the gospel message as having universal application. It is for Jew and Gentile. The church is the "New Jerusalem" making all things new.

The promise made to the prophets is being fulfilled today, God is making his dwelling with the human race, so that all people," will be His people, and God himself will always be with them." It is all pretty heady stuff, an exalted vision of John's view of the church in this post-resurrection period.

One wonders how seriously we take this vision in our modern secular society. Do we see ourselves as sons and daughters in this new realm? Are we indeed his "faithful ones?" The love that John speaks of is no human love, but a supernatural love that is modeled on the love Jesus showed us in dying for us on the cross.

That kind of love is only possible by the Spirit that is poured into our hearts at Baptism and it is by this love that we glorify the Father. Amen
