We also believe that it's important in the coming years for Europe to step up in a big way to provide for its own defence—the threat that I worry the most about vis-a-vis Europe is not Russia, it's not China, it's not any other external actor. The story of the Catholic convert who grew up in Appalachian rural poverty to attain the second highest office in the United States is inspiring in its defying of odds. His chronicled memoirs, Hillbilly Elegy, speak of the not-too-uncommon struggles of a broken family life that grip so much of America; and yet given a chance to serve in the military eventually, JD went on to earn a law degree from Yale. To now see the Vice President on the world stage with his wife (the uber elegant Usha) and children signifies a hope that in choosing the path of discipleship and integrating its demands into family, domestic, and foreign policy, a viable way forward is being written by someone who holds public office. JD Vance's speech was not without controversy; because he dared address the decades long declining trend of the abandoning of Catholic Social teaching by the majority of Europe's parliamentarians, the continent now stands enfeebled in its economic and military positions, sagging in birth rate, and so often criminalizing

The scripture readings for this sixth Sunday of Easter illustrate the challenges the Church has faced from its inception all the way to its heavenly destination. The command Jesus sets before us is to love Him and keep his words. The mandate of Christians is to persuade a non-believing and often hostile world that fidelity to the gospel and a social order that is in harmony with the Kingdom of Jesus Christ is humanity's only plausible hope. JD Vance is fulfilling an important mission in giving credible voice to the Churches' traditional teaching on political theology, taking into account the secularism and multi-religious realities of nations, and presenting a compelling case of their time-tested wisdom.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

public expressions of faith and free speech.

The first Church council, the Council of Jerusalem we hear about in today's First Reading, decided the shape of the Church as we know it.

Some Jewish Christians had wanted Gentile converts to be circumcised and obey all the complex ritual and purity laws of the Jews. The council called this a heresy, again showing us that the Church in the divine plan is meant to be a worldwide family of God, no longer a covenant with just one nation.

Today's Liturgy gives us a profound meditation on the nature and meaning of the Church. The Church is One, as we see in the First Reading: "the Apostles [bishops] and presbyters [priests], in agreement with the whole Church [laity]."

The Church is Holy, taught and guided by the Spirit that Jesus promises the Apostles in the Gospel.

The Church is Catholic, or universal, making known God's ways of salvation to all peoples, ruling all in equity, as we sing in today's Psalm.

And the Church, as John sees in the Second Reading, is Apostolic—founded on the twelve Apostles of the Lamb.

All these marks of the Church are underscored in the story of the council. Notice that everybody, including Paul, looks to "Jerusalem [and] . . . the Apostles" to decide the Church's true teaching. The Apostles, too, presume that Christian teachers need a "mandate from us."

And we see the Spirit guiding the Apostles in all truth. Notice how they describe their ruling: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us."

Knowing these truths about the Church, our hearts should never be troubled. The Liturgy's message today is that the Church is the Lord's, watched over and guarded by the Advocate, the Holy Spirit sent by the Father in the name of the Son.
