Sunday, June 1st 8:00 am - Legion of Mary - Vietnamese Does ecumenism consist in confessing or in hiding the truth? Ought the Council to explain Catholic doctrine, or the doctrine of our separated brethren?... Hiding the truth hurts both us and those separated from us. It hurts us, because we appear as hypocrites. It hurts those who are separated from us because it makes them appear weak and capable of being offended by the truth. Let the schemas be separated. Let us profess our faith openly. Let us be the teachers we are in the Church by teaching with clarity, and not hiding what is true."

His Excellency, Giocondo Grotti, Bishop of the Diocese of Acre and Purus, Brazil (1928-1971)

The timeline and events of Bishop Grotti, in his short-lived life, give him all the credibility to utter the bold statement that was recorded in one of his interventions during the Second Vatican Council. Born in a small town outside of Bologna, his evangelical zeal inspired him to join the Marian Servite order, and after formation in Padua, he was sent as a priest to serve in the missionary region of western Brazil. His earnest effort to provide sacramental care and catechetical teaching to the peoples living in remote rain forest canopied villages of the Amazon basin provided him a sold platform to speak authoritatively during key conciliar theological debates. Whereas there were strong proponents within the Church to seek a more conciliatory and congruous tone with heretical factions, Bishop Grotti new first hand that compromise on matters of dogma and worship threatened the very Christ given mandate, "that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations." Shortly upon his return to his diocese, Bishop Giocondo Grotti was involved in an airplane crash that killed all 32 passengers on board.

As the Church celebrates Our Lord's Ascension into heaven, the average Catholic can not help but feel ambiguity and hesitation in the command to "make disciples of all nations." While it is understood that coercion and force can never be part of any genuine missionary effort, the heightened deference shown to the various Christian denominations and other world religions is such that it would seem insulting and demeaning to insist on the command that all are to be baptized and enter into the safety of the Churches' embrace. We pray that we are given leaders with firm faith to guide us and illustrate as to how to win converts to Christ through words of compelling conviction and irresistible sweetness.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's first reading, St. Luke gives the surprising news that there is more of the story to be told. The story did not end with the empty tomb, or with Jesus' appearances to the Apostles over the course of forty days. Jesus' saving work will have a liturgical consummation. He is the great high priest, and he has still to ascend to



the heavenly Jerusalem, there to celebrate the feast in the true Holy of Holies.

The truth of this feast shines forth from the Letter to the Hebrews, where we read of the great high priest's passing through the heavens, the sinless intercessor's sacrifice on our behalf (see Hebrews 4:14–15).

Indeed, his intercession will lead to the Holy Spirit's descent in fire upon the Church. Luke spells out that promise in the first reading for the feast of the Ascension: "in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5). Ascension is the preliminary feast that directs the Church's attention forward to Pentecost. On that day, salvation will be complete; for salvation is not simply expiation for sins (that would be wonder enough), but it is something even greater than that. Expiation is itself a necessary precondition of our adoption as God's children. To live that divine life we must receive the Holy Spirit. To receive the Holy Spirit we must be purified through baptism.

This is the "good news" the Apostles are commissioned to spread—to the whole world, to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem—at the first Ascension. It's the good news we must spread today.
