At night I would climb the steps to the Sacre-Coeur, and I would watch Paris, that futile oasis, scintillating in the wilderness of space. I would weep, because it was so beautiful, and because it was so useless.

- Simone de Beauvoir (1908-1986), <u>Memoirs of a Dutiful Daughter,</u> 1958

On this Solemnity of Corpus Corpus Christi, the cited quote is intended to draw our attention to the immense Basilica of the Sacred Heart rather than its author. Simone de Beauvoir is synonymous with the poisonous ideologies of radical feminism, marxism, and existentialism. Neither of the philosophical positions merits elaboration; it is sufficient to note that each signifies a world view in bitter opposition to traditional Catholic piety, dogma, and morality. Her sensationalized marriage to the equally disordered Jean-Paul Sartre is a lesson in counter distinction to the vows of fidelity and fruitfulness. Nevertheless, even in Simone's bitter sarcasm, she is speaking an obvious truth in her surveying the monumental shrine of the Sacred Heart and the city of Paris. The city has been the scene for horrific bloodshed and rebellion. The juxtaposition of both the grandeur of its glorious Cathedral and breathtaking basilicas has also been the stage for the horrors of the guillotine during the reign of Terror in the aftermath of the Revolution.

As for the famed Sacre-Coeur, perched high on top of Montmartre, its construction came about in response as an act of reparation to beg God for mercy as to what took place during the siege of Paris during the Franco-Prussion war and the subsequent Paris Commune (1870-1871). The Parisians were disgusted with the defeat to their loathed rivals; they forced President/Emperor Louis Napolean III out of the capital and commandeered control of the city. With a blockade imposed on the city by Prussian forces, the citizens were left to starvation with grotesque stories of having to resort to eating whatever animals roamed the streets (cats, dogs, rats, mice) and those caged in the city zoo. Accordingly, the immense Sacre Coeur shrine was commissioned as a sign of undoing the humiliation suffered; perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament has persisted since 1875, even during the two World Wars of the 20th century. The 2020 pandemic saw the doors locked for 2 months for the first time during March and April. Also notable, as Paris has continued this hot and cold drama of secularization and devotion, last year's summer Olympics added another chapter to this storied saga. After the debacle of the opening ceremony, the city was plunged into a blackout with all lights out except the luminous glow of the majestic Sacre Coeur radiating its glorious presence to a city and world gripped in the confusion of doubt and disbelief.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Eucharist is given to us as a challenge and a promise. That's how Jesus presents it in today's Gospel. He doesn't make it easy for those who hear Him. They are repulsed and offended at His words. Even when they



begin to quarrel, He insists on describing the eating and drinking of His flesh and blood in starkly literal terms.

The heavenly manna was not given to satisfy the Israelites' hunger, as Moses explains. It was given to show them that man does not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. In today's Psalm, too, we see a connection between God's Word and the bread of life. We sing of God filling us with "finest wheat" and proclaiming His Word to the world.

In Jesus, "the living Father" has given us His Word come down from heaven, made flesh for the life of the world. In the Eucharist we are made one flesh with Christ. We have His life in us and have our life because of Him. This is what Paul means in today's Epistle when he calls the Eucharist a "participation" in Christ's body and blood. We become in this sacrament partakers of the divine nature.

This is the mystery of the faith that Jesus asks us believe. And He gives us His promise: that, sharing in His flesh and blood that was raised from the dead, we too will be raised up on the last day.
