Patience is a sign that the soul is intimately united to God and that it is rooted in perfection. For it must be very much in God and fully possessed by him in order to bear difficulties and torments with peace, tranquility and even joy and beatitude in one's heart.

It must be quite profoundly immersed in him and remain quite powerfully and strongly united to him, so that the flesh has no power at all to attract it to itself and share with him the feelings and aversions that it has towards suffering and endurance.

In this state the soul experiences the perfection attainable in this life, since it conforms to our Lord's perfect submission to God during his sufferings. For although his flesh experienced aversion and revulsion for the cross, he paid no attention to it with his will. Rather, he always adhered perfectly to the wishes of his Father.

Fr. Jean-Jacque Olier (1608-1657), Founder of the Sulpicians

On this Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, the priest of little renown, (Fr. Olier) offers a beautiful insight to honour Our Lord and be of benefit to his disciples. Fr. Olier may not hold a name of prominence in the life of the contemporary Church, yet he had a significant impact on his times within his native city of Paris and beyond. Seeking to implement the educational reforms of the Council of Trent for both seminarians and lay people, Fr. Olier gathered other clergy to help promote and propagate a robust catechesis. The humble priest wanted to fuel the devotions of the faithful so that they may have a firm foundation of understanding that would allow them to resist the swirling heresies of Protestantism. He had notable friends such as St. Francis de Sales and St. Vincent de Paul and plenty of other young men who saw in the demanding intellectual and spiritual formation proposed a heroic call to serve Christ and fellow man. Bishops started sending seminarians from around France to be part of the Society of St. Sulpice's community life, located in the 6th arrondissement, which was, at the time, outside the Latin Quarter neighbourhood, and notorious for how brute and rough its inhabitants were. The work of the committed priests not only reversed the fortunes of the parish community but they started sending out missionaries to other parts of the French speaking world, including the newly founded city of Montreal. The massive Church that was subsequently built to replace the smaller, older building is now second in city size only to Notre Dame, and even larger that Montmartre's, Sacre Coeur. With its Gothic soaring walls, ornate stained glass windows, oasis-like side altars, the Church is yet another priceless treasure of Christendom; moreover, to the left of the sanctuary stands a mesmerizing statue of a Sorrowful Christ who tenderly embraces the Cross he is about to carry. Given the Feast we celebrate this day and the cited quote of the priest who nobly pastured the Church that hosts the masterpiece, it is well worth pursuing an online search to see the work of art for oneself.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Our readings this weekend focus on the sin of Idolatry. It is perhaps the most powerful sin, the one from which others originate. When we think of idols we tend to think of statues and handmade objects worshipped by people in ancient days



But our modern idols bear no resemblance to those things. Our idols today are more sophisticated. Today many have replaced the "golden calf" of Exodus with an insatiable drive for money, success or prestige in the eyes of the world. Some seek after comfort of a myriad other empty pursuits. Some even worship themselves.

An idol is anything that replaces God in our heart such as possessions, careers, relationships, hobbies, sports, entertainment, goals, greed, addictions to alcohol/drugs/gambling/pornography, etc.

Some of these things are bad in themselves, but some are good. They become a sin when we give them all our time and attention. We believe they will bring us happiness, the happiness only God can give.

The things of this world will never fully satisfy the human heart. They were never meant to. The sinful things deceive us and ultimately lead only to death (Romans 6:23). The good things of this world are gifts from God, meant to be enjoyed with a thankful heart, in submission to Him and for His glory.

Let us pray for the right attitude towards the things of this world.


