Happy New Year!!!

*Hark how the bells, sweet silver bells
All seem to say, "Throw cares away"
Christmas is here, bringing good cheer
To young and old, meek and the bold
Ding-dong, ding-dong, that is their song
With joyful ring, all caroling
One seems to hear, words of good cheer
From ev'rywhere, filling the air
Merry, merry, merry, merry Christmas*

- Carol of the Bells, English translation from the original Ukrainian folk hymn, Shchedryk

If one is not already saturated with play and repeat of Christmas songs by now, the cited "Carol of the Bells" can captivate listeners not only with its enchanting four part harmony but also with a back story that is equally fascinating. The familiar opening melody (ding, ding, dong, ding) was already part of the repertoire of Ukrainian common chant, passed along from generation to generation. In 1916, as World War I wreaked its havoc, the Ukrainian people sensed the squeeze from the Austrian/Hungarian/Germanic empire of the West to the rising danger of the Bolshevik led Russian Revolution to the East. To strengthen Ukrainian identity, a composer by the name of Mykola Leontovych wrote lyrics to the folk tune. To bolster worried spirits, the lyrics described the visit of a sparrow to a farmer's home bringing reassurance that soon spring would eventually return with its promise of bounty: fields of abundant harvest, livestock fertile with numerous offspring, and a beautiful family secure, warm, and well fed. (The title of the song, "Shchedryk" translates as "bountiful".) The song was taken on tour throughout Europe and proved to be an instant sensation. By the time it made its premiere in New York City at Carnegie Hall in 1922, an American composer of Ukrainian descent, Peter Wilhousky, recognized the immense potential of the song based on the thunderous ovations it received; in 1936, the Carol of the Bells was released as we now know it.

Obviously, it is impossible not to call to mind the bitter struggle of the noble Ukrainian people of the then and the now. Whereas a century ago they feared the loss of their Byzantine/Slavonic liturgy, customs and way of life, the current ugly and tragic plight of Ukraine has been forefront on the world stage for the past 3 years. Broken-hearted over the way foreign meddling and interference has pushed their young men into carnage and death, the bright and Utopian visions of abundant harvests and prolific family life appear as if they may never return. In their following of the Julian calendar, the Ukrainian Church is set to enter into their worship of the Christ Child. Their need for a Saviour to deliver them is recognized as more urgent than ever.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Why did Jesus choose to become a baby born of a mother and father and to spend all but His last years living in an ordinary human family? In part, to reveal God's plan to make all people live as one "holy family" in His Church.



In the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, God reveals our true home. We're to live as His children, "chosen ones, holy and beloved," as the First Reading puts it. The family advice we hear in today's readings—for mothers, fathers, and children—is all solid and practical. Happy homes are the fruit of our faithfulness to the Lord, we sing in today's Psalm. But the Liturgy is inviting us to see more, to see how, through our family obligations and relationships, our families become heralds of the family of God that He wants to create on earth.

Jesus shows us this in today's Gospel. His obedience to His earthly parents flows directly from His obedience to the will of His heavenly Father. Joseph and Mary aren't identified by name, but three times are called His "parents" and are referred to separately as His "mother" and "father." The emphasis is all on their their familial ties to Jesus. But these ties are emphasized only so that Jesus, in the first words He speaks in Luke's Gospel, can point us beyond that earthly relationship to the Fatherhood of God.

In what Jesus calls "My Father's house," every family finds its true meaning and purpose. The Temple we read about in the Gospel today is God's house, His dwelling. But it's also an image of the family of God, the Church. In our families we're to build up this household, this family, this living temple of God until He reveals His new dwelling among us and says of every person: "I shall be his God and he will be My son".
