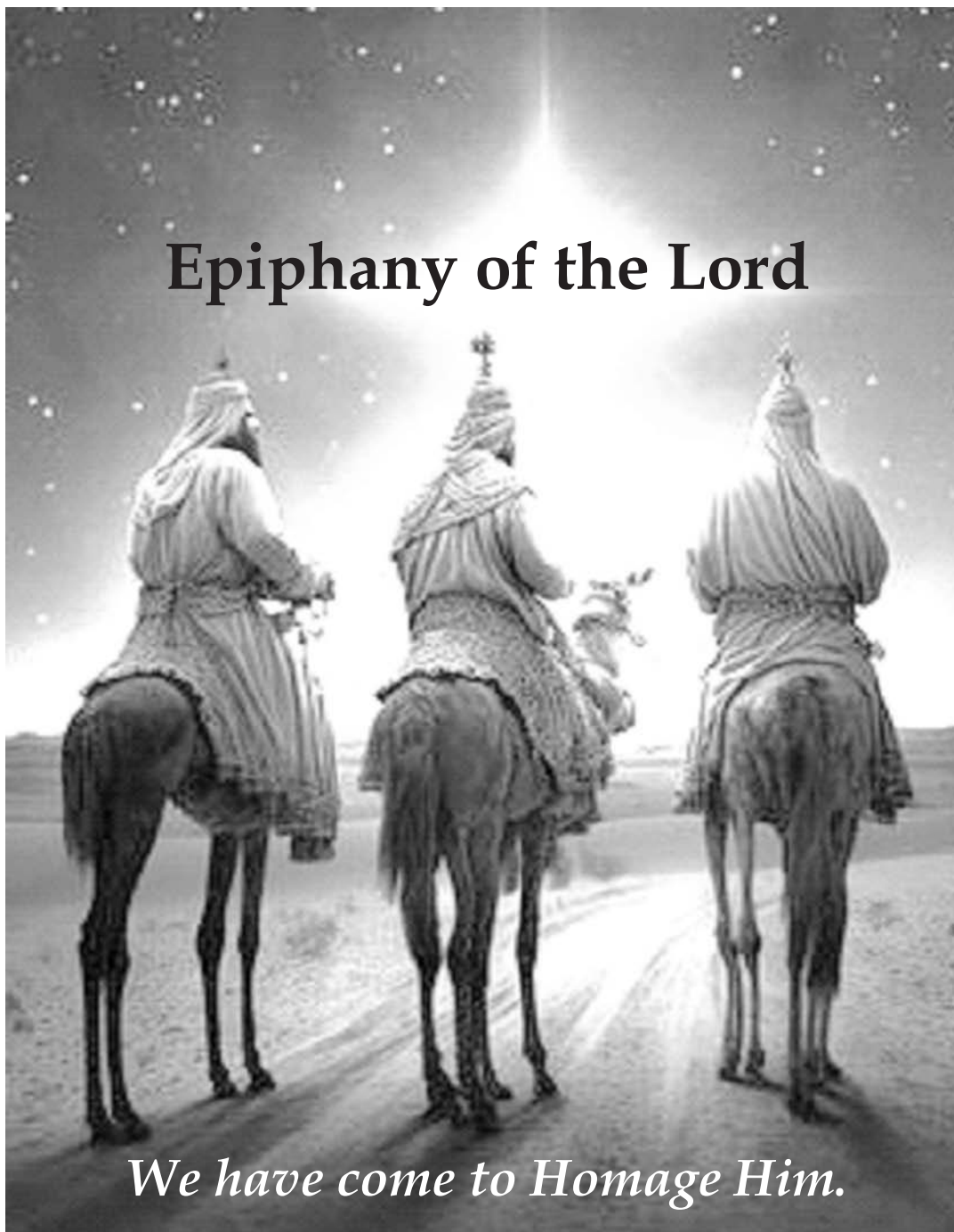

excerpt from the Litany of St. Genevieve (422-500), found at her sarcophagus in the church of St. Etienne du Mont, Paris, Feast day, January 3

Amid the myriad of tourist attractions in the city of Paris, no top ten travel adviser ever lists St. Genevieve, patron of Paris, as a must see. While she has been overlooked in modern times, her legacy is well stamped on the lore of the famed city.

History records that a missionary bishop, (St. Germaine l'Auxerrois) took note of the young Genevieve and her interest in what he had to say. He prophesied that she would go on to be a tremendous gift to the Church and the city. (Just behind the Louvre gallery, along the northern bank of Seine, is a basilica honouring his memory.) Through her life of prayer and penance, Genevieve became a contemporary version of Queen Esther. She averted the pillaging of marauding invaders (Attila and Vandals), her devotion to St. Denis (beheaded saint of Montmartre) was the impetus to having a basilica constructed over his tomb, and her formidable witness helped inspire the baptism of France's first Christian King, Clovis. After her death, her much visited tomb and relics became the pilgrimage destination of the faithful where healings and miracles were all attributed to her powerful mediation. An abbey in Paris' Latin Quarter under her patronage encouraged other women to dedicate themselves to study, liturgy, prayer and intercession; eventually, the Sorbonne University emerged from the shared space. In post French Revolutionary hostility, St. Genevieve's memory and relics were attacked sacrilegiously by those looking to erase the influence of the Catholic faith upon the citizenry. The new regime looked to eclipse the popularity of St. Genevieve by repurposing the Church building hosting her tomb (now Paris' Pantheon) and using it as a mausoleum be the final place of rest of the Enlightenment heroes. With St. Genevieve's relics scattered and lost, the sarcophagus that once held her remains is now to be found in a smaller but beautifully eloquent church, St. Etienne du Mont. And so, while the Eiffel tower, l'Arc de Triomphe, les champs d'Elysees, Lafayette Gallery, Jardin du Luxembourg all command greater tourist attention, stepping into this lesser known gem preserves the legacy of one of Paris' most impressive champions.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The visit of the wise men, the Magi, occurs only in Matthew's gospel. It is much shorter and simpler than most readers likely remember. Over the years they have been given different names and historical appendages, probably because the story has a certain cultural appeal.

In these short lines there is magic (a moving star), intrigue (Herod's questioning) and a surprise ending (they fell down and did him homage.) They are often portrayed as visiting Jesus in the manger, but this is highly unlikely. The holy family must have found more comfortable accommodations by then. Jesus would have been about two and living in Bethlehem.

The gifts they gave Jesus are rather strange and not at all age appropriate. Gold, frankincense and myrrh. Here there is no sentimentality, no little Lord Jesus who lay down his sweet head. Rather these gifts point to his kingship, his holiness and his death and suffering.

In a sense we are all Magi. We are all searching, chasing and calculating our way through this world. The question is whether we will allow God to do something new in our lives. Whether we trust God enough to lead us and guide us.

May our search for God be as single-minded and resolute as the wise men. Amen.
