And I, a sinner, have been trying to love God for more than forty years, and cannot say that I perfectly love Him. If we love someone we always remember him and try to please him; day and night our heart is occupied with that object. Is that how you, gentlemen, love God? Do you often turn to Him, do you always remember Him, do you always pray to Him and fulfill His holy commandments? For our good, for our happiness at least let us make a vow that from this day, from this hour, from this minute we shall strive to love God above all else and to fulfill His holy will.

- St. Herman of Alaska (1756-1836)

With the twelve days of Christmas behind us, the New Year presents us with the formidable challenge of fueling our resilience for coping with the cold months ahead. Whether one has faced the harshness of Canadian winters all one's life or are just recently trying to discover fashionable ways to layer up for the frigid temperatures, motivation is welcomed anywhere one can find it. Back in the dog days of summer, August 15 to be precise, for those paying attention to specifics, during the Russian/American peace summit, President Vladimir Putin presented President Trump with an icon to acknowledge the shared solemnity of the Assumption; additionally, President Putin also gifted his American counterpart with an icon of an Orthodox holy man, St. Herman. The otherwise unknown hermit's life merits acclaim. As part of a Russian expedition departing from Moscow, the harrowing trek through the expansive Siberian plains, the Bering Strait crossing, and the vast Alaskan coast line is not for the feeble. St. Herman's 20 year training as an Orthodox monk shaped him for the daunting mission. Consequently, the habits of disciplined fasting, strenuous labour, and capacity for prayer and solitude forged Herman for the challenge of keeping up with and handling his more brutish fellow voyageurs. They settled south of Anchorage on Klondike island: a land known for the huge bear that reigns sovereign in the region, and the surrounding bay that teems with salmon and halibut. Befriending the local indigenous Aleut people, he vigorously defended them against his compatriots who were looking to take advantage of them through unscrupulous trade scheming. The cited quote captures his intense scolding of his fellow Russians whose lewd and despicable behaviour was a danger to their own souls and a scandal to those St. Herman desired to evangelize. St. Herman eventually set up a hermitage on a neighboring island and happily lived out his remaining days interceding for his newly adopted people and land.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the Magi, have been made "coheirs" to the blessings promised to Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.



Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new "exodus"—opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God.

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him "a covenant of the people," the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations. Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, "anointed . . . with the Holy Spirit and power."

The word messiah means "one anointed" with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of Jacob". The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest.

That's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of today's Gospel. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever.

In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters as a fiery flame, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passageway to healing and freedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life.
