*Submitting to the will of Providence and the law on the inheritance of sovereignty, we assume this burden in a terrible hour, testifying before the Most High that imparting this authority to us in so difficult and troublesome time, he will not withhold his all-powerful help from us...Dedicating ourselves to our great Service, we appeal to our faithful subjects to serve us and the state truly and faithfully, so that the foul treason which shames the Russian land may be uprooted, faith and morality be reaffirmed, children be reared rightly, falsehood and corruption be exterminated, and order and justice be imparted to the activities of the institutions given to Russian by her benefactor, our beloved father.*

*-Tsar Alexander III, St. Petersburg address, on the occasion of his elevation after the assassination of his father, 1881*

In attempting to untangle the knots of history, the temptation to revisionist interpretations to support a current ideological narrative is prevalent. Victim groups who condemn past failures for present injustices need to be aware of anachronistic biases. Imposing present standards on past cultures is risky especially if one chooses to be ignorant or defiant of the errors and evils of our contemporary ethical conduct. The period leading up to the Russian Revolution of October 1917 not only holds pivotal importance for the shaping of modern Europe but because it was also highlighted in Our Blessed Mother's Fatima message, it also carries prophetic importance. The cited quote is Tsar Alexander III's inaugural manifesto to the Russian people. The subversive Bolshevik atheist revolutionary forces were seeking to overthrow the influence of the Russian Orthodox Church. Tsar Alexander III was trying to maintain civil order by appealing to Christ's sovereign reign and his sacred vow to be the embodiment of that sacred rule. The source of anarchy and rebellion was being sewed by the German Enlightenment movement that promulgated liberation through Marxist and Freudian propaganda. Tsar Alexander III sought an alliance with France to force Germany to divide its expansive aggression on two fronts. The French government appreciated the pact to such an extent that they built the artistic masterpiece of the Pont Alexander III bridge across the Seine river in Paris, halfway between Notre Dame and the Eiffel Tower. Tsar Alexander III's efforts to rein in the spreading communist insurrection was insufficient. Not only was his father assassinated but his son, Tsar Nicholas II, together with his wife and five children were shot and stabbed, ending the Romanov dynasty. We continue to pray for the full reconciliation of the Orthodox and Catholic Church.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In the Church, we have been gathered as the new "Israel of God". He has made us His own people, the flock He tends, as we sing in today's Psalm. Moses was Israel's first shepherd. With the Promised Land in view, he prayed that God would raise up a successor so that God's people would not be left as sheep without a shepherd. These same words are used in today's Gospel to describe Jesus' pity for the crowds, who are "troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd."

Israel's shepherds—the Pharisees and scribes—had abandoned and misled the people through their hypocrisy and spiritual blindness. But God had long before promised that He Himself would come and save His sheep—searching over the whole earth where they had been scattered "for lack of a shepherd".

Jesus is the new Moses and new David promised by the prophets, a divine shepherd-king sent to restore God's priestly kingdom. As Moses commissioned Joshua as his successor, so we see Jesus today giving the Twelve His powers and authority. In God's plan, they are to seek out the lost sheep of Israel first and then bring all nations into the fold.

Together we have been saved and reconciled to God, as we hear in today's Epistle. As He delivered Israel, He has also made us a kingdom of priests in the Church.

So we come in this Mass to serve Him with gladness, to praise His kindness, which endures forever.
