"So also, when you see these things take place, you know that he is near, at the very gates." - Mk. 13: 29

The first generation of Christians was quite hopeful to see the "Son of Man coming in clouds". However, this desire to witness Christ's imminent return began to fade in later first century. This transition can be found within the New Testament as evident through Paul's Letter to the Ephesians where he is not hesitant to write about 'the coming ages'; the Church as it were then had to consider the next generation and its future here on earth, without losing sight of eternal life. Today, with the help of the Scriptures, we are aware and alert of His Second Coming. In fact, many of us perceive the signs of the times in anticipation of Christ's return.

When my family decided to immigrate to Canada, it was for reasons like many others; greater opportunity for education and employment, freedom and tolerance of our beliefs, to name a few. Western civilization has its many advantages, albeit not exempt from advanced signs of decay. As faced by many immigrant families, cultural differences tend to create discord among one's own flesh and blood. In circumstances where governments around the world promote decadence through openly legalized vices, I find personal and family prayer as a means to navigate through murky waters. Otherwise, the anxiety of believing that in our own generation, we are indeed imminently close to some of the cataclysmic chastisements suggested in this Sunday's Scripture readings can stir feelings of dread. As 17th-century Catholic theologian Blaise Pascal wrote in his *Pensées*, "some kinds of evil are almost as difficult to discover as that which we call good; and often particular evil of this class passes for good." By focusing our thoughts and deeds on Jesus and His return we can triumph over the lurking evil. Although we do not know the day or hour that Christ spoke of, let us pray for the grace to be able to stand before Him and be engulfed in His great power and glory. *Ana Sairah Mathew*

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK Lord, listen to my prayer: Turn your ear to my appeal. You are faithful, you are just; give answer. Don not call your servant to judgment For no one is just in your sight. The enemy pursues my soul; He has crushed my life to the ground; He has made me dwell in darkness Like the dead, long forgotten. Therefore my spirit fails; My heart is numb within me. Psalm 143. 1-3

As we continue our spiritual focus, in this month of November, with its somber mystery of death, let us seek comfort in the words of Sacred Scripture. I find it reassuring that God understands and acknowledges our anxieties and worries when confronting the reality of dying. As the psalm verses suggest, death can very much feel like a dreaded foe in unrelenting pursuit of our life dragging us to the dreaded and terrible moment of judgment. While the Resurrection of Jesus, the hope of eternal happiness of heaven, and the longing for full communion with all the blessed loved ones who have gone before us are all meant to be the vantage point for us to stand up to the certainty of the end of our earthly lives. I laugh in mock ridicule at the numerous claims that developing and rapid advances in biotechnology may be able to soon unlock the keys to immortality. Suffering and the cross will always be part of the human experience. Reconciling ourselves to our loving Saviour is our most sane and desirable option.

In the meantime, the days of November can trigger so many memories of the experience of dying. Past funerals of loved ones, long vigils of bed side care with a family member, moments of shock and trauma from an expected tragedy, grey dark rainy days, graveside tears, perhaps coping with your own illness...I pray that in all these experiences God may chip away at and melt the dominating stranglehold of which the fear of death grips our hearts to give way to the bright promise of life everlasting. In the meantime, we persevere in praying...may perpetual light shine upon them and the souls of the faithfully departed rest in peace.
