And while we were advancing tow'rds the middle, Where everything of weight unites together, And I was shivering in the eternal shade, Whether 'twere will, or destiny, or chance, I know not; but in walking 'mong the heads I struck my foot hard in the face of one.

Weeping he growled: "Why dost thou trample me? Dante Aleghieri (1265-1321), Canto 32, Divine Comedy, Inferno

In the great Florentine poet's cited vision of hell, the description is counter-intuitive. Dante, together with Virgil, his guide, descend to the lowest circles of hell. Up to this point, they have observed the various eternal punishments of those condemned. The damned are each reaping a cursed sentence that is very much self-made and selfinflicted. Whatever pains and deprivations they endure, they are all a result of having obstinately and determinedly scorned and rejected God. Consequently, Dante seeks to show that the souls bound in hell are not so much getting what they deserve, but in some mysterious way, a penalty of their own making in identifying more with their chosen rebellious action and attitude above and against God.

And so, as we find ourselves in the deep of winter, consider that those souls closest to Satan are not in a burning fire but rather frozen in ice. The bitter weeping and gnashing of teeth is the result of their having betrayed God and loved ones unrepentantly. The frozen barren landscape of the pit of hell is the opposite of God's warmth and radiance. As we seek to tough out a Canadian January (and with two more months of cold to come!), we pray that all the alarming talk of escalating fuel and heating costs may not prove dire for those most at risk.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In the first reading today Isaiah prophesied that Zebulun and Naphtali, the lands first to be degraded by the conquering Assyrians, would be the first to see the light of God's salvation. Jesus today fulfills that prophecy—announcing the restoration of David's



kingdom at precisely the spot where the kingdom began to fall. His gospel of the Kingdom includes not only the twelve tribes of Israel but all the nations—symbolized by the "Galilee of the Nations." Calling His first disciples, two fishermen on the Sea of Galilee, He appoints them to be "fishers of men," gathering people from the ends of the earth.

They are to preach the gospel, Paul says in today's Epistle, to unite all peoples in the same mind and in the same purpose—in a worldwide kingdom of God.

By their preaching, Isaiah's promise has been delivered. A world in darkness has seen the light. The yoke of slavery and sin, borne by humanity since time began, has been smashed.

And we are able now, as we sing in today's Psalm, to dwell in the house of the Lord, to worship Him in the land of the living. God Bless
